WVFL Supported Redistricting Reform

The members of West Virginians for Life understand that, for our legislators, redistricting is a personal issue affecting their seats in the WV Legislature. West Virginians for Life's involvement in the redistricting issue was not undertaken so that we could take positions on the individuals, whose seats are affected by any changes brought about by redistricting. We truly appreciate the hard work everyone has done in the past to promote the cause of protecting human life from fertilization to natural death and we support the hard work our representatives have done for our innocent children.

However, West Virginians for Life has observed that members of our organization are systematically disenfranchised by the presence in our state of large multi-member districts. We believe that these large multi-member districts should be reformed by reducing the number of members in these very large districts. The largest district in our state is District 30 in Kanawha County with seven members. This is the second-largest delegate district in the country. The only opportunity we have to make any changes is during the votes taken on redistricting every ten years. The state legislature met the first week of August to deal with redistricting, due to population changes from the 2010 census.

West Virginians for Life expressed our intention to score an amendment to the

Redistricting Plan, which would break District 30 (Kanawha County) into a larger number of districts with fewer members each. The original amendment that we intended to score originated with District 30 Delegates Doug Skaff and Eric Nelson. Brent Boggs, Chairman of the Redistricting Committee, and the remaining delegation of District 30, came back with a compromise amendment breaking District 30 into only two districts of four and three members each. This amendment passed unanimously with a voice vote. We applaud the efforts of those members of the legislature, who worked to reform West Virginia's largest multi-member district.

As a grass roots organization, we are aware of the importance of making sure that West Virginia lives up to the calls in our Constitution for truly representative government that makes it possible for the folks to "assemble and to petition the government for a redress of grievances."

It was in this spirit that we engaged in both our recent successful suit to overturn sections of the "campaign finance law" passed previously by the WV legislature (see Press Release below) and in this support for redistricting reform. We thank the staff and volunteers of West Virginians for Life for their hard work in helping to bring about some reform in our multimember districts.

The following was released by the James Madison Center for Free Speech on July 20, 2011.

A federal district court has struck down unconstitutional definitions of express advocacy and electioneering communications in West Virginia. West Virginians for Life, Inc., sought to engage in radio ads, mass mailings, petitions, and newspaper ads addressing pro-life issues involving a person who was a candidate for the Supreme Court of Appeals of West Virginia. In some cases, West Virginians for Life actually engaged in its speech. The speech did not expressly advocate the election or defeat of any candidate by using words such as "vote

for" or "vote against." Nevertheless, the speech clearly identified a candidate, and ran or was to run shortly before an election in areas where West Virginia residents could vote for the candidate.

West Virginians for Life feared the state would regulate all of its speech by defining it as "express advocacy" or an "electioneering communication." Then the organization would have to file reports on all of the speech with the state.

Worse yet, West Virginians for Life feared the state would define the organization as a full-fledged political committee, which means complying with West Virginia's political-committee burdens, such as registration, recordkeeping requirements, and extensive reporting requirements.

The court's decision addresses the express-advocacy, electioneering-communication definition, and political-committee definitions.

First, the district court limited West Virginia's express-advocacy definition to how the U.S. Supreme Court defines express advocacy.

The court rejected West Virginia's attempt to define express advocacy by an "appeal-to-vote" test. Under such a test, West Virginia could have regulated speech if its only

"reasonable interpretation is as an appeal to vote for or against a specific candidate." The court said such a test is a vague express-advocacy definition.

Second, while government may regulate broadcast electioneering communications, the court said West Virginia had not justified regulating non-broadcast electioneering communications.

"The district court followed Supreme Court case law in a way that is a tremendous victory for free speech," said James Bopp, Jr., general counsel of the James Madison Center

for Free Speech, which brought the challenges on behalf of West Virginians for Life. "Organizations such as West Virginians for Life need to be able to engage in non-regulable speech without fear of fines or imprisonment."

Third, the court held that West Virginians for Life is not a political committee under West Virginia law. The reason is that supporting or opposing candidates is not the organization's sole purpose.

This court noted that an organization devoting as little as 1 percent of its spending to other activities, such as charitable work, is not a political committee under West Virginia law.

This is so even if it would be constitutional to define the organization as a

political committee under Supreme Court case law.

From the President

Dear Friend of Life,

West Virginians for Life is dedicated to the goal of over-turning the Supreme Court abortion decision making abortion a constitutional right in America. There are only two ways to reverse this decision. Either we pass an appropriate amendment to the Constitution or the members of the Court reverse it themselves. We cannot reverse it right now, but we refuse to look the other way while innocent people are dying. We will continue to support laws that will save as many lives as possible, while educating the public on abortion.

Here in West Virginia, the following protective laws have been passed as a direct result of the lobbying efforts of West Virginians for Life:

- a Partial-Birth Abortion Ban Act (1997)
- a Women's Right to Know Law (2003)
- an Unborn Victims of Violence Act (2005), and
- an Ultrasound Option Requirement Act (2010).

Passing these laws requires the hard work and dedication of many staff members and volunteers.

Now we have a brilliant new model law that we believe has the power to outlaw some abortions, while, at the same time, focusing attention on the baby in the womb. This law is based on new scientific evidence that conclusively demonstrates that unborn babies feel pain by at least 20 weeks from fertilization. The new law is called the "Pain-Capable Unborn Child Protection Act" and it would safeguard unborn babies from abortion when medical evidence shows they can feel pain.

West Virginians for Life wants to stop abortion after the unborn child can feel pain. We will be working on passage of this law in our next legislative session. However, we cannot do this without your help. It is essential that all concerned pro-life West Virginians join with us. We need the financial resources to hire a fulltime lobbyist for our legislative session. You can help us by becoming a member. This is the only way to make

Charleston Man Assaulted Ex for NOT Having Abortion

In some cases women abort because of pressure from the father of the baby. That pressure can get downright criminal if not deadly. Case in point...

The Charleston Daily Mail found that according to police reports, a Charleston man told his ex-girlfriend to have an abortion,

and then sexually assaulted her. Bruce Cook, 48, of Randolph Street in Charleston was arrested August 1 after his ex-girlfriend told Charleston police he assaulted her.

It happened Saturday, July 30 at Cook's apartment, the victim said.

The victim, who is three months pregnant with another man's child, told officers Cook told her to have an abortion. When she refused, he held a knife to her stomach and told her he would abort the baby, according to a complaint filed in Kanawha County Magistrate Court.

She said he then picked her up and carried her to a bed where he touched her inappropriately. She said she told him to stop, but that he refused. She was able to get away from Cook and later told police about the incident.

Cook was charged with first-degree sexual assault. He is being held at South Central Regional Jail on \$10,000 cash bond.

This may sound like an isolated crime, but it happens far more than people realize. According to LifeNews.com there is a Utah man who formerly lived in western Colorado who stands accused of giving his pregnant girlfriend the second part of the two-part abortion drug

in an attempt to force her to have an abortion.

In the Utah case, 31-year-old Jared Merril Ahlstrom appeared in Mesa County District Court on August 2 where he faces a felony charge of unlawful termination of pregnancy. The drug eventually caused a miscarriage and the death of the unborn child.

In December, a Seattle-area man found himself in police custody after allegedly killing his girlfriend and their infant daughter after the woman refused his request to get an abortion. Daniel Thomas Hicks is charged with two counts of first-degree murder in the death of 28-yearold Jennifer "J" Morgan and 13-month-old Ema Morgan. Hicks was charged after he was apprehended following the discovery of the bodies by Morgan's mother and cooperation with other relatives who aided them

in locating Hicks. Legal papers the Times obtained say Hicks wanted Morgan to have an abortion and claimed she "was just trying to trap him with the pregnancy." They say Hicks made several threats about killing Morgan and himself.

Unborn Babies Feel Pain

All human beings begin life at fertilization, when we have the human DNA that directs our development. Very early in development, we acquire the physical form of our human appearance, including all the structures that are part of being human. For example, our hands and fingers develop and we begin to exercise them, using our fingers and eventually our thumbs to practice grasping. Our DNA also directs the development of all of our other human capabilities, including our ability to feel pain. When does the unborn baby acquire the ability to feel pain?

We know that, by 18 days after fertilization, the brain begins to take shape and the spinal cord starts to grow. At 5 weeks, pain receptors appear around the mouth and, at 6 weeks, the unborn child first jerks away from a touch to the mouth. In weeks 6 to 18, the cerebral cortex develops; and in weeks 8 to 16, the thalamus develops, functioning as the main relay center in the brain for sensory impulses going from the spinal cord to the cortex. By 20 weeks after fertilization, pain receptors, spinal cord, nerve tracts, thalamus, and cortex are in place. All anatomical links needed for feeling pain are present.

How do we know what the baby is feeling? Pain is a tricky thing to measure, because it requires an outsider to try to guess what is going on inside another person. Visual observation suggests that people are in pain when they pull away from a stimulus and begin to avoid the source of the pain. We even see these behaviors in animals. Do we see it in the unborn child? We do, according to David Birnback, M.D., president of the Society for Obstetric Anesthesia and Perinatology, who testified that, "Having administered anesthesia for fetal surgery, I know that on occasion we need to administer the anesthesia directly to the fetus, because even at these early gestational ages, the fetus moves away from the pain of the stimulation."

But how bad is it really? What is the unborn baby really feeling? We now have techniques to measure the degree of painful stimulation. When painful stimuli occur, our body responds by putting out stress hormones. By measuring the level of the stress hormones in the body, we can determine that pain is being experienced. This is the case in everyone who has been born. As early as 18 weeks from fertilization, stress hormones are released by an unborn child being injected by a needle, just as they are when adults feel pain. Furthermore, researchers have demonstrated that hormone levels decrease in babies as pain-relievers are supplied during fetal surgery. Human pain begins very early in human development.

If an unborn baby at 20 weeks gestation "is fully capable of experiencing pain.... Without question, [abortion] is a dreadfully painful experience for any infant subjected to such a surgical procedure," stated Robert J. White, M.D., Ph.D., professor neurosurgery, Case Western University. The pro-life movement recognizes the need to act to protect unborn babies from the pain of abortion. West Virginians for Life will be working for passage of the Pain Capable Unborn Child Protection Act, which outlaws abortion at 20 weeks when scientists agree unborn babies can feel pain.

Five states have already passed the Pain Capable Unborn Child Protection Act and may more are working on its passage. So far these laws have not been challenged in court. Babies can be protected from the pain of abortion. Planned Parenthood - Largest Abortion Provider in U.S.

Planned Parenthood of America has worked to develop an image of being a social service organization dedicated to helping families. However, this slick veneer covers a much darker, pro-death agenda. Planned Parenthood is the nation's largest promoter and provider of abortions, performing about a third of all abortions done in the United States (332,278 in the most recent of their reports).

Planned Parenthood argues they are performing "legitimate" health services for women and, therefore, deserve enormous amounts of tax-payer funded government grants and contracts. In fiscal year ending June 30, 2009, they received \$363.3 million from the American taxpayer. None of this money is supposed to pay for the abortions women receive from Planned Parenthood. However, it clearly maintains the organization and physical plant supporting the abortion business.

Furthermore, legitimate health services are offered by numerous other health programs in any community. If the money is taken away from Planned Parenthood, it will all go to other community organizations and no legitimate health services will be lost. The only "service" offered by Planned Parenthood that is unique to them is abortion. The only reason to continue to fund them is to make abortions possible.

Here are some of the statistics that demonstrate this point. Abortion constitutes approximately 37% of Planned Parenthood's revenues. Of services to pregnant women, 98% are abortions. For every one adoption referral made by Planned Parenthood, it performs 340 abortions. One in every eight women entering a Planned Parenthood facility gets an abortion.

In April of this year, Congress failed to cut off federal funding for Planned Parenthood. The House of Representatives voted to cut off funding, but the Senate voted against that legislation. Senators Jay Rockefeller and Joe Manchin both voted against cutting off federal funding to Planned Parenthood. Jay Rockefeller's family has long-time connections with eugenic organizations like Planned Parenthood, and they have been funding them for generations. However, Joe Manchin went to Congress as a pro-life supporter, supposedly dedicated to ending abortion and saving lives. His betrayal of the babies is truly an outrage.

Gallup Finds "Pro-Choice" Americans Back Most Abortion Limits

When abortion backers say most Americans are "pro-choice" on abortion, new polling data from Gallup finds that not only is that incorrect but even a strong majority of "pro-choice" Americans support most abortion limits.

On August 8 Gallup released more of its most recent polling data on abortion, where it asked Americans if they support a wide range of pro-life laws that have been effective in stopping abortions. As Gallup notes:

"Self-described 'prochoice' and 'pro-life' Americans agree about nine major areas of abortion policy, while disagreeing on eight others. Among the areas of consensus, in which a majority of both groups hold the same opinion, especially large percentages are in favor of requiring informed consent for women (86% of pro-choice adults and 87% who are pro-life) and making abortion illegal in the third trimester (79% and 94%)."

Some 86 percent of "pro-choice" Americans women favor giving information about abortion's and alternatives beforehand, 79 percent favor banning abortions in the third-trimester, 63 percent favor banning partial-birth abortions, 60 percent support parental consent for minors, 60 percent back a 24-hour abortion waiting period, and even 52 percent of "prochoice" Americans want abortions to be made illegal in the second trimester.

The only abortion limits where those who describe themselves as favoring legalized abortion differ with pro-life advocates are allowing women a chance to see ultrasound before an abortion (where 28 percent of "pro-choice" people agree with such a law), banning federal funding for abortion businesses (23 percentagree), and allowing pharmacists and medical workers to opt out of participating in or referring for abortions.

The Gallup survey also found "pro-choice" Americans support abortion as a means of birth control (64 percent), in the first trimester (89 percent) and when the baby may have a condition such as Down syndrome (76%), or physical disabilities (75%). also support abortion when a pregnancy "endangers" a woman's mental health (87 percent), even though most research shows abortion causes more mental health issues than carrying to term.

Earlier this year, Gallup found churchgoers are more likely to have a pro-life position opposing abortion. Regardless of whether the person surveyed by Gallup is a Democrat or Republican, the poll found those who attend weekly religious services are about twice as likely to self-identify as pro-life compared with respondents who say they seldom or never attend church services.

Gallup also found that. by a 24 percent margin, 61-37 percent, Americans take the pro-life view that abortions should either be legal under no circumstances or legal only under a few circumstances. Although Gallup doesn't specify those "few" circumstances, polling data has consistently shown that, when asked about cases such as rape, incest, or the life of the mother, a majority of Americans want all or almost all abortions made illegal — leaving only life of Areas of Abortion Policy Consensus Between Pro-Choice and Pro-Life Americans

the mother or rape and incest as the exceptions.

Gallup measured U.S. public support for the legality of abortion in each of seven specific circumstances, as well as in each trimester, in a June 9-12 national survey. A follow-up survey conducted 15-17 measured Americans' support for several different abortion regulations that become common across the states, as well as for abortion funding policies. The survey found a 47-47 percent split when Americans identify themselves as either pro-life or "pro-choice" on abortion.



Pro-Life Profile

Judy Sloane was born in West Virginia and is proud of this fine state. She would not want to live and serve her Lord anywhere else. (But she is willing to go wherever He leads her). She has been married nearly 34 years to a man she refers to as "the most awesome man in the world, my husband Terry." Judy's education and experience has always been geared toward business. She is amazed how she can look back on her life and see HIS Hand guiding

her along with experiences that prepared her to fulfill HIS ultimate purpose for her life. Judy and Terry are members of Christian Missionary & Alliance Church in Morgantown. They have attended CMA for 20 years. They love their church family and are always so appreciative of the unwavering support they receive.

The Sloane's calling into ministry did not come easy for them. They had been caregivers for Judy's mother, who was an Alzheimers patient for almost 5 years. She died the day before Mother's Day in 1997. A few months later, the Sloanes were approached by Dr. Mike Rollins and Dr. Jim Holehouse about coming on board with them and serving as Houseparents in the maternity home they were actively wanting to open. It took them nearly a year to be willing to say yes to this calling, and then they put a time limit of two years on their willingness to serve. That was in 1999. The Sloanes are still there. Obviously, God had other plans for them than what was in their heads at the time!

The calling to work with crisis pregnancy was very strong for Judy because, as a teenager, she had two abortions. Judy states that those two abortions were the absolute worst decisions she ever made in her life. She understands what it is like to be faced with the fear associated with an unplanned pregnancy and she knows what it is like to live with the aftermath of an abortion...AND...she understands what it is like to see her life transformed by the forgiveness and grace of Our Lord Jesus. When invited by Dr. Rollins and Dr. Holehouse to join with them in serving as Houseparents in the maternity home they were working to open, it just felt natural and right. Terry also felt led to come alongside with Judy. As a childless couple, they felt that perhaps this was part of the reason God had chosen for them not to have their own children. What they have discovered is that God did have plans for them to have a family, just in the most unusual way.

Labor of Love Ministries opened its doors as a maternity home ministry in April, 1999. During that time, they have had 77 young women call New Beginnings home. Over an amazing 12 years the Sloanes have cried many, many tears with hurting young women, they have rocked many, many babies whose lives have been saved through the home, and they have rejoiced many, many times with young women who began to make good choices for their lives and the lives of their babies.

In 2002, the Sloanes took over the Morgantown Crisis Pregnancy Center and

changed the name to Choices 4 Life Pregnancy Center. During the past nine years, they have counseled nearly 500 young women and have had 140 babies whose lives have been saved from abortion. In 2006, the Sloanes opened the third leg of the ministry, called The Lighthouse Christian Academy. This is a small Christian School open to the community and to all students K-12. Its mission outreach is to pregnant teens and single moms.

The biggest challenge the Sloanes face in the ministry is keeping the doors open. Raising enough funds to keep a ministry of this size operating is a huge undertaking (and a huge stressor!). They are in desperate need of individuals and churches who want to stand with them on a monthly basis to help support them financially so they can continue to serve with HIM in HIS WORK at Labor of Love. Finances are their greatest need.

Judy believes each of us must ask ourselves one question. How important is protecting LIFE to me personally? If you answer "it is very important," then you must meet with HIM and do business with HIM and decide how you can support ministries such as Labor of Love. Labor of Love's support must come from those who are committed to their work and see the importance of it... because it is a work that is extremely important to Jesus. Judy feels we must all band together and work together for the greater cause of protecting LIFE... saving these precious babies from being victims of poor choices made by frightened and uninformed mothers.

This is the calling that HE has put upon Judy's life. She will fight for LIFE until she takes her last breath because she knows, without a doubt, that HE has asked her to be HIS hands, His heart, His ears, His eyes, and HIS VOICE to the hurting of this world. He has asked her to "Save Lives, Change Lives and Bless Lives!"

Younger Christians More Likely to See Abortion as Important

Mainstream media reports on abortion make it seem as if concern about abortion is fading, but new polling data shows that younger Christians are more likely than older believers to see abortion and euthanasia as important.

A new survey commissioned by Premier Christian Media and conducted by the ComRes polling agency in England, surveyed Christians of all ages and Christian denominations in Britain asking them to rate the issues in terms of how important they are to the respondent. The survey found pro-life and end of life issues were of greater concern to young people

aged between 18-34 years compared with those over the age of 65.

Almost three quarters (69%) of young people surveyed believe abortion to be very important compared to just 31% of those over 65. Similarly, two-thirds (66%) of young people think euthanasia is a very important issue compared with just one-third (33 percent) of those over 65. The poll also found 60 percent of those between the ages of 35-44 say abortion is very important to them.

Women were more likely to say abortion is important — at a 56-44 percent clip compared with men.

"It's fascinating to see that young people are concerned about pro-life and end of life issues," said Martin Saunders, Editor of *Youthwork* magazine, in response to the survey. "This poll bucks the trend that perceives young people to be thoughtless."

"The media perhaps has a part to play in shaping the perception we have of both groups," Saunders continued. "Euthanasia has dominated the media recently, which has led many young people to be aware of the issue. It is encouraging to see that both groups are concerned about one another's well-being and not solely on issues that affect their own age group."

Andrea Williams, CEO of Christian Concern, also commented on the results, and said, "It is great to hear that a younger generation of Christians are passionate about life issues and understand so clearly that life is precious and that we are all made in the image of God. The survey gives me great hope for the future. I believe that the younger generation will take the

baton and stand for truth and be a witness to the nation."

ComRes surveyed 529 UK Christians on Cpanel between July 6 and July 18 and data was weighted by denomination to reflect the composition of the UK Christian population according to the 2005 Church Census.

The results of this new survey follows on the heels of three polls from earlier this year showing young adults are pro-life.

Based on interviews with 3,000 adults, the Public Religion Research Institute found that Americans, regardless of generation, believe abortion is morally wrong — but young Americans between the ages of 18 and 29 agree with that conclusion as well. The survey found 52 percent of Americans say abortions are morally wrong.

A late May Gallup poll found Americans want all or most abortions made illegal and saying they believe abortion to be morally wrong.

By a 24 percent margin, 61-37 percent, Americans take the pro-life view that abortions should either be legal under no circumstances or legal only under a few circumstances. Although Gallup doesn't specify those "few" circumstances, polling data has consistently shown that, when asked about cases such as rape, incest, or the life of the mother, a majority of Americans want all or almost all abortions made illegal — leaving only life of the mother or rape and incest as the exceptions.

By age, Americans also oppose abortions — with 59 percent of people aged 18-34, 58 percent of those 35-54 and 64 percent of those over the age of 55 saying all or almost all abortions should become illegal. Younger Americans are most supportive of making all abortions illegal, with 24 percent of 18-34 year-olds saying so and 35 percent saying they want abortions legal only in a few circumstances. Meanwhile, a new poll conducted by Thomson Reuters for NPR asked "do you personally believe having an abortion is wrong" and 59.3 percent of Americans polled said yes compared with just 40.7 percent who said no. The youngest age category of those polled, under 35, gave the most pro-life responses with 65.5 percent saying that having an abortion is wrong.
