New York and the Harsh Reality of the Pro-Abortion Mindset

When New York Governor Andrew Cuomo signed the abhorrent “Reproductive Health Act” into law last week, he heralded the new mandate as the “most aggressive” abortion law in the country.

“Aggressive” is the right word.

Legalizing abortion for practically any reason up to birth, the law allows 9-month-old babies to be lethally injected in the head or heart and delivered dead days later. Frightful as that is—aggressive as that is—it is exactly how a third-trimester abortion is carried out in modern-day America.

And unfortunately, the law doesn’t stop there. It even removes protections for unborn babies killed in an act of homicide.

This is what the New York Senate applauded on January 22. This is why the spire of the One World Trade Center was emblazoned pink.

Try as they might to defend this new law under the mantle of “choice,” this celebratory mindset is unmistakably

“pro-abortion,” a label many abortion defenders shirk from because its cold truth doesn’t resonate with middle America.

Although many will insist that no one is pro-abortion, the euphemism “pro-choice” won’t fly here.

Cuomo and abortion advocates in the state legislature forfeited that

on social media. He even received death threats. His simple, articulate assessment of the immoral law went like this:

I want to clear something up so that there is absolutely no doubt.

I’m a Board-Certified OB/GYN who has delivered over 2,500 babies.

There’s not a single fetal or maternal condition that requires third trimester abortion. Not one. Delivery, yes. Abortion, no.



by the self-proclaimed defenders of women’s choice.

The vilification of Dr. Hamada and other pro-life care providers shows just how extreme abortion advocates have become. They won’t even entertain a medical expert’s well-reasoned opinion if it preserves or honors life in any way.

It’s no wonder that the New York law allows non-physicians to perform abortions. With brave critics like Hamada shredding their horrid justifications for late-term abortions, the abortion lobby needs as many co-conspirators as they can get.

But even as activists hound Hamada, women themselves are speaking up. Countless pictures of courageous mothers and tiny babies have proliferated online as women tell their stories of preterm delivery and harrowing battles with maternal conditions such as cancer. These stories are stories of empowerment. Stories of hope. Stories of compassion for the smallest and weakest among us. And that’s why they’ve been shared tens of thousands of times over the last week.

As states like Rhode Island, Vermont, and New make moves to copy New York’s nightmarish new policy, stories like these and opinions like Hamada’s should remind us all of how terribly regressive this aggressively pro-abortion agenda truly is.

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moniker long ago. Just last summer, he and his allies went so far as to malign the state’s 100-plus pro-life pregnancy help centers—life-affirming, charitable alternatives that offer women other choices than the brutality and heartbreak of abortion.

At the behest of the abortion lobby, assembly members introduced a bill targeting these centers with bogus investigations, and Cuomo launched a public awareness campaign specifically designed to undermine these centers’ life-saving efforts.

These actions are undeniably, aggressively pro-abortion, and as the news of this most recent, odious law spreads, the world is bearing witness to that truth.

Physicians are speaking out, and abortion activists are turning to their same angry, deceitful tactics to silence them.

One OB-GYN, Omar Hamada, received hysterical backlash from abortion activists after he deconstructed the supposed “necessity” of late-term abortion

The Will to Live at the End of Life

Dear Friends,

In West Virginia, the law contains an extensive section describing your ability to sign documents that direct health care personnel on what kind of treatment you want at the end of your life. When you enter a hospital, you are asked to provide such documents. You need to understand what these documents will do; and you need to protect yourself from signing away your actual intentions for your end of life care.

There are two general categories of documents. A medical power of attorney is a document that gives legal power to a person of your choice to make medical decisions for you if you should become incapacitated at the end of life. It is important that you make this choice for yourself, otherwise a judge may end up choosing someone to fill that role.

A second type of document is what is referred to as a Living Will. It poses a problem because this type of document uses terms which the ordinary, untrained person will interpret differently than the way the same term is used in technical, legal language.

For instance, a Living Will generally recommends against providing “extraordinary treatment.” Most people are inclined to say that they wouldn’t want to receive “extraordinary treatment” if they were in a terminal condition. The problem is that what might appear to be ordinary care to most people might come under the category of “extraordinary care” when used by the hospital system. Most people, for example, assume that provision of food and fluids is virtually always considered ordinary care. However, if your illness makes it difficult for you to feed yourself in the ordinary way, and you require a feeding tube, your provision of food and fluids suddenly becomes “extraordinary care” under legal policies governing hospital regulations with living wills in place. Specifying that you do not want to receive “extraordinary treatment” in a Living Will document *will most likely be interpreted as a demand from you not to be given food and fluids through a feeding tube when you have trouble feeding yourself.* The average American would never expect food and fluids to be considered “extraordinary.”

However, this is not the only way in which language is misused in the Living Will context. Another example has to do with the use of the term “terminal” when discussing the terminal state of an illness. Most Americans assume that “terminal” means that a person is immanently dying, having exhausted all options for medical intervention. But “terminal” is increasingly equated with “irreversible,” meaning that a condition cannot be cured or reversed. But when a condition cannot be cured, it does not mean that you will die soon. There are millions of people suffering from chronic diseases that cannot be cured, but because of modern medicines, they might nevertheless live on for many more decades.

Now, because “irreversible” has been broadened

to include “irreversible *conditions*,” it is a euphemism for anything that can be considered a “permanent disability.” A paraplegic in a wheelchair, a blind person requiring special lenses, a diabetic on insulin—these are all examples of the many individuals who fall under the category of having irreversible conditions. Indeed, strictly speaking, being alive is a terminal condition; because eventually we will all die.

The Robert Powell Center for Medical Ethics at the National Right to Life Committee opposes the so-called Living Wills because of the vagueness of the language in these documents, and the way in which their seemingly harmless terms are open to a variety of interpretations—interpretations that could cause denial of treatment far beyond the intent of those who sign them. It seems more rational to sign documents that say you want to be treated and then specify those items that you don’t want. Rather than a Living Will, most of us who value life would rather sign a Will to Live. The Robert Powell Center for Medical Ethics has prepared Will-to-Live documents tailored to each state’s laws, and these documents include the provision for your medical power of attorney.

It is important to understand that there is a difference between a statement of principle and a legal document. A legal document provides specific directions, as defined by law that can guide specific actions. It helps to look at this from a more ordinary perspective. We can agree on the principle that an employee should receive a “just wage.” We can agree with our employer that we ought to be paid a “just wage.” However, none of us would agree to an employment contract that simply stated we would receive a “just wage.” We expect the contract to provide a specific amount.

Similarly, with an advanced directive, it is not enough to say that we do want to receive “ordinary medical care.” We need to specify exactly what we want in terms that have specific legal power to protect us. The Will to Live (in contrast to run-of-the-mill “Living Wills”) is a document that begins with the presumption for life. It calls on the medical establishment to provide medical care, unless the patient requests special conditions related to individual medical needs, which are outlined in the document.

The bottom line is this: If you are someone who doesn’t want medical technology to prolong your last hours, but who also doesn’t want to be starved to death like Terri Schiavo or allowed to die just because you have a disability, your wishes will be far more likely to be respected if you sign a properly prepared Will to Live than if you sign a so-called Living Will. **You** can obtain a copy of West Virginia’s *Will to Live* by going to our website at wvforlife.org and clicking on “End of Life Issues.”

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Current Legislation in the 2019 Session

SB 642 – A Bill to Provide Options in Living Wills and Combined Power of Attorney Living Wills.

This legislation tackles the specific issue of the provision of nutrition and hydration to patients who have been judged by one physician to be in a terminal condition or in a persistent vegetative state. West Virginia law a present includes model language for Living Wills that are generally used by most medical facilities in the state. These current Living Wills do not make clear that, when signers of these documents ask that medical treatment be removed, it includes the removal of food and water provided intravenously or by feeding tube.

Our legislation corrects this dangerous possibility of confusion. It will provide clear choices on the Living Will form for the patient to indicate whether artificially-provided food and fluids are desired or noted, unless the body is unable to assimilate them or the provision of the food and fluids becomes excessively burdensome to the patient. The removal of these basic necessities of life will hasten or even cause the death of the patient.

- SB 642 will improve the language in the Living Will.
- SB 642 will prevent the inadvertent starvation and dehydration of patients.
- SB 642 will promote patient autonomy and ensure informed consent.

Anti-Euthanasia Activist Alex Schadenberg to Keynote 21st Annual Rose Dinner

Alex Schadenberg will keynote the 21st Annual Rose Dinner on Thursday, April 4, at the Holiday Inn, Pineview Drive, in Morgantown.

Schadenberg has been the Executive Director of the Euthanasia Prevention Coalition (EPC) since July 1999 and became the International Chairperson in 2007. EPC's goal is to build a well-informed, broadly based membership of groups and individuals in order to establish an effective social barrier to euthanasia and assisted suicide. EPC is based in Canada, and is working to launch EPC-USA in May in Washington, DC. EPC-International, which has standing at the UN, has member groups in Europe, Australia, New Zealand, and Ireland. EPC has organized numerous international symposiums on euthanasia and assisted suicide, drawing attention to this world-wide epidemic.

Alex has had articles published in newspapers world-wide and has the world's most widely read blog on issues related to euthanasia and assisted suicide (www.alexschadenberg.blogspot.com). Alex has become known as the definitive source of information on issues related to euthanasia and assisted suicide as seen in his book entitled, *Exposing Vulnerable People to Euthanasia and Assisted Suicide*. He is currently working on a book featuring the best articles on euthanasia and assisted suicide. EPC's video entitled, "Turning the Tide," sold more than 1800 copies since 2007.

Alex is also a world renowned speaker and has spoken throughout Canada, the United States, Australia, New Zealand, Scotland, Switzerland, Belgium, and Italy. Alex has debated euthanasia enthusiasts Jan



Bernheim, Wanda Morris, and Udo Schuklenk.

Alex works with many other groups to establish an effective world-wide opposition to euthanasia and assisted suicide, such as: HOPE Australia, TAS, Choice is an Illusion, and the Care Not Killing Alliance.

EPC released *The Euthanasia Deception* in September 2016, a documentary containing stories of people with personal experiences with euthanasia and assisted suicide.

Most recently release in May of 2018 was *Fatal Flaws: Legalizing Assisted Death*, a film that reveals the flaws in

assisted death laws around the world.

The Euthanasia Prevention Coalition currently has more than 4700 members, almost 13,000 followers on Facebook and 23,000 email contacts.

Alex is married to Susan and they have six children.

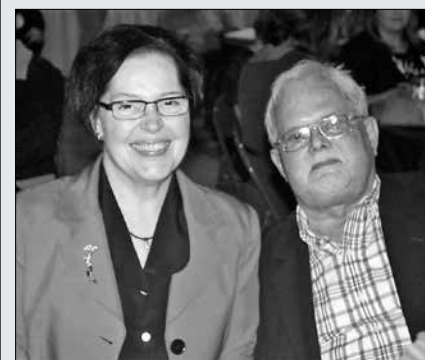

MARCH for LIFE

2019

The theme of the march this year was “Unique from Day One: Pro-Life is Pro-Science.” Jeanne Mancini, President of The March for Life organization, explained the reasoning behind this year’s theme like this, “Science is behind the pro-life movement. We see that medical and technological advancements always affirm the pro-life movement, for example. DNA is present at fertilization and no fingerprint on earth, past, present or future, is the same. We know, too, a baby’s heart beats at just six weeks and we can distinctly observe it ourselves with ultrasound technology. As science progresses, we see clearly that every life is unique from day one in the womb.”

On Friday, January 18, our able and experienced bus captains, Donna and Chris Kolanko, graced our 45-member group with a prayer and we were off at 4:00 a.m. sharp.

By 9:30 a.m., we were parked in Washington D.C. and heading to the Rayburn Building for a meeting with representatives from the offices of Senators Shelly Capito and Joe

Ms. Cross discussed the passage of Amendment 1 and proposed West Virginia legislation, the Non-Discrimination in Involuntary Denial of Treatment Act. Attendees, including Louise Deal, Mary Tillman, Pam Iaquina and Pastor Sean Wightman, had the opportunity to ask questions and make comments following each representative’s presentation.

Our group then proceeded to the National Mall for the Rally which featured a variety of speakers including Ben Shapiro, editor-in-chief of The Daily Wire, Abby Johnson, founder of And Then There Were None and Dr.

Alveda King, director of Civil Rights for the Unborn. Attendees were also honored with a surprise appearance by Vice President and Mrs. Pence who spoke to the crowd and introduced a video message from President Trump. The President, in his video message, promised to veto any legislation reaching his desk “that weakens the protection of human life.”

The actual march down Constitution Avenue commenced a bit late due to the large turnout. An estimated 600,000 people attended this year, including a large number of pro-life youth. While

waiting for the march to begin, we met some people from Syracuse, NY and a group of students from Biloxi, MS.

Our group left the march at 2:30 p.m. to return to the bus so that we could get on the road ahead of traffic. We stopped briefly on the ride home and were safely back in Morgantown by 8:30 p.m.

The trip was perfectly timed. Donna Kolanko updated our group during the bus ride on key legislation and related activities that West Virginians for Life is planning. We were blessed with mild, dry weather and a safe journey. It was a beautiful day to bond with a wonderful group of people. We especially enjoyed having some of the most seasoned marchers in our bus group: Bill Heffern (84 years of age and his 45th March for Life!), and J.W. Boyle (94 years of age). Hope Springs from March for Life

On January 18, as our chartered bus rolled out of the Morgantown Sears parking lot at 4:00 a.m., it occurred to me that this was my first March for Life in over 35 years. Growing up in Greensburg, PA, I had the blessing of having a pro-life mother who taught me the truth about Roe v. Wade and gave me a nudge every January to attend the March. Memories of previous marches with Catholic high school friends flooded my mind: singing spiritual songs, shouting pro-life chants, cheering at the rallies, consuming vast amounts of junk food on the bus... feeling confident that our efforts would be rewarded eventually with the repeal of Roe v. Wade.

Now, years later, I was back on that bus as a wife, a mother of six, and a recent grandmother. Those years have been busy for the Pro-Life Movement as well. There have been pro-life victories, particularly at the state level, as well as defeats.

A victory will sometimes be answered with a disappointment, as the enemy struggles to claim more victims for abortion. Roe v. Wade remains the law of the land, the holocaust of little souls continues, but the pro-life movement pushes on.

Having rejoined the cause of life a few years ago as a chapter member of West Virginians for Life, I admit it can sometimes be discouraging. Victories, such as the passage of Amendment 1 in West Virginia (Yay!), come with plenty of explicative-laced phone messages at our chapter office, challenging fund-raising efforts for our politically incorrect cause, and lackluster support from many religious leaders, including some Catholic priests.

But there is hope for the weary. The 2019 March for Life in Washington D.C. provided plenty of opportunities for pro-life sisters and brothers to be heard, energized and inspired. The crowds numbered close to 600,000, according to some reports. Speakers Ben Shapiro, Abby Johnson and Vice-President Mike Pence lifted spirits with messages of truth, support and encouragement. Attendees came from all over the country and were truly some of the kindest and most respectful people one could hope to meet. What really provided so many of us hope for the future of this movement, though, was the overwhelming participation of youth in the march.

There were high school and college students everywhere, and they were vocal. Some were even wearing matching knit caps (not shaped like body parts) in various school colors and they were fired up. Their energy was palpable and infectious. What is causing this surge in youthful support isn’t “rocket science,” it’s simply science and education.

Ben Shapiro, speaking to the theme of the March for Life 2019, “Unique from Day One: Pro-Life is Pro-Science,” told Shannon Bream in an interview with Fox News, “The truth is, the real momentum in the pro-life movement is about young people who have seen 3D and 4D ultrasounds and who have actually seen the pictures.” Science is proving to the young that unborn babies aren’t just a blob of tissue. The sonogram pictures are getting better and they tell a much different story.

In addition, pro-life organizations like Students for Life of America are having a tremendous impact on youth. SFLA is a national organization that focuses on educating and organizing school students from middle school to graduate school on life issues. According to their website, they have trained 44,223 students, created 1,031 groups, and operate in 49 states. Thanks to SFLA, pro-life organizations are popping up in schools and on campuses everywhere and they are active.

So, seasoned pro-life warriors, help is coming. The fact that so many victims have been claimed by abortion, both mentally and physically, since Roe v. Wade, has challenged our mission. 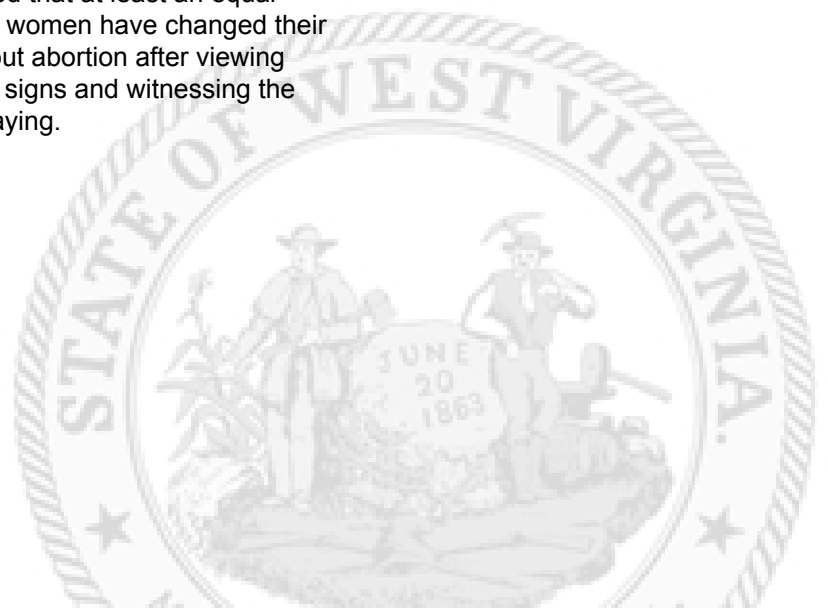
