From the President



Polling and the 2020 Election

Dear friends,

The 1973 Supreme Court decisions, *Roe vs. Wade* and *Doe vs. Bolton* gave women in the United States the constitutional right to have an abortion for all nine months of the pregnancy for any reason at all. Only the Supreme Court can reverse itself to make it possible for the legislatures to pass bills that outlaw abortion.

President Trump has appointed strong, constitutionally-oriented judges to the Supreme Court, which has triggered the anticipated reactions from all sides of the abortion debate. Lawyers on both sides of the issue disagree among themselves about the willingness of the Supreme Court to address the abortion issue.

There are at least two complicating factors that make it difficult to anticipate with accuracy how the Supreme Court will rule on abortion. The first is *stare decisis*, a judicial doctrine under which the Court follows prior decisions when deciding a case on similar facts. The second is a technical term, the "undue burden standard," which the Court has adopted, which prevents laws that have the purpose or effect of placing a substantial obstacle in the path of a woman seeking an abortion. For example, laws, which require that women must get consent of both parents or a spouse to have an abortion, have been struck down by the Supreme Court using this standard.

It is unlikely that the Supreme Court will rule to reverse the 1973 abortion decisions any time soon. Court-watchers point out that, on paper, the Supreme Court has a 5 to 4 conservative split. In theory, it is possible to overturn a previous Supreme Court decision with this one-vote advantage. However, historically, it generally takes full support of all nine members of the Court to directly overturn a decision under the doctrine of *stare decisis*. Our current Court

has four solid pro-abortion votes.

In most past cases where the Supreme Court has overturned a previous decision, the Court made use of an incremental process. The bad precedent is undermined by many smaller steps developed in numerous Court decisions. Eventually, the precedent becomes a hollow shell of itself and is effectively overturned.

Only one of the current Justices has stated in a judicial opinion that he would overturn *Roe vs. Wade* and *Doe vs. Bolton*. That is Justice Clarence Thomas. He has strongly argued that the use of the "undue burden standard" in the case of abortion is unconstitutional. We don't know how the other Justices would rule if abortion were to come before the Court.

At this time, it is too early to know what would happen if a direct attack on the abortion rulings were taken up by the Supreme Court using bills such as the "Life at Conception Act" or "Heartbeat" bills. There are only five possible votes on the Court, but we don't know if they would take the step of over-looking *stare decisis* in order to overturn the abortion decisions of the last 46 years.

The pro-life movement must continue to provide the Court with laws that allow for an incremental process toward overturning abortion. One such law is the Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act, which we are introducing in the state legislature this year. (See page 3). In addition, this law will save lives while we continue to work toward our goal of overturning *Roe* and *Doe*.

Because babies have been left to die in West Virginia following failed abortions, the priority of West Virginians for Life will be to pass a Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act this legislative session. See the testimony of a nurse on our web site at wvforlife.org. She found a baby dying on a dirty utility room counter in a West Virginia teaching hospital. Her testimony is powerful.

We believe the Born-Alive bill can pass in the next legislative session which begins January 8, 2020. The three-fold purpose of the bill is to require that the child born alive as a result of abortion receives the same care as any other child delivered at the same gestational age. The bill applies criminal penalties to those who violate the law and a civil cause of action to women harmed by violations of the Act.

Lead sponsors of the Born-Alive bill are Senator Patricia Rucker in the Senate and Delegates Kayla Kessinger and Jeff Pack in the House. Many cosponsors are expected to sign on. Governor Justice has said that he will sign the bill.

On the federal level, our West Virginia delegation has voted for the Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act in spite of the myriad number of times that action on the bill has been thwarted.

West Virginians for Life (WVFL) is pleased to report that Karen Cross will be the Legislative Coordinator for the bill.

Improving the WV Living Will in 2020

This January, WVFL will again present the "Options in Living Wills" legislation that we proposed last year in Charleston. Although we succeeded in passing the legislation through the Senate, we ran out of time to convince the House leadership to put the bill on the agenda. Consequently,

Mary Tillman, as Legislative Coordinator of a new subcommittee within WVFL called the WV Alliance for Ethical Health Care, has been going to the interim sessions to educate legislators why we are proposing this, and seeking sponsors.

The purpose of this new subcommittee is to garner support from legislators and advocacy groups that normally do not agree with us on the abortion issue. Thus, certain legislators who normally do not vote pro-life on abortion, DO favor protecting the rights of disabled persons. Similarly, there are multiple organizations in the state that will lobby for the rights of disabled persons, but remain neutral or even in favor of abortion. We expect that, like last year, we will be joined again in this effort by the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston.

The bill would amend that portion of the WV Code that sets forth sample language for the legal forms known as "Living Wills" and "Combined Medical Power of Attorney and Living Will." Instead of the current dangerous language whereby artificially-administered nutrition and hydration (provided by IV or feeding tube) must be removed from patients diagnosed to be terminally ill or in a "persistent vegetative state," the proposed

PASS THE BORN-ALIVE ABORTION SURVIVORS PROTECTION ACT IN 2020

Bills that legalize the killing of unborn babies until birth have clearly caused a blurring of the distinction between abortion and infanticide. West Virginians are asking, "Can this happen in West Virginia?"

This bill will protect infants born alive following an attempted abortion. It would require hospitals and medical personnel to exercise the same degree of care for the baby born alive as a result of a failed abortion, as would be given to any other preborn child at the same gestational age. It provides for immediate transport to facilities capable of caring for such children, and it provides for reporting requirements in the event the law isn't observed.

Improving WV Living Will

NEW sample language would present two options to people: (1) to choose to receive food and fluids (with the further explanation that they would be discontinued if the body becomes unable to assimilate them, OR if the provision became excessively burdensome to the patient); or (2) to refuse the food and fluids, with the explanation that such refusal could hasten or cause death.

As recently as 2018, the American Academy of Neurology and other medical groups issued revised quidelines for the treatment of disorders of consciousness, one of which is the so-called vegetative state (PVS). The new guidelines admit that there is a misdiagnosis rate of 40% for PVS. Some studies have indicated that within 12 months, up to 52% of PVS patients regain some level of consciousness. Furthermore, new treatments are being developed that are showing promise for some patients.

By amending the Code to insure people realize what they are signing is only common sense, and essential to informed consent.

In the meantime, we advise that the forms commonly provided by hospitals around the state NOT be used. Please instead, go to wvforlife.org for a "Will to Live" form tailored to WV state law, with its protective language.

PRESS RELEASE from National Council on Disability - Federal study finds nation's assisted suicide laws rife with dangers to people with disabilities

WASHINGTON (October 9, 2019) – Today, the National Council on Disability (NCD) released the findings of a federal examination of the country's assisted suicide laws and their effect on people with disabilities, finding the laws' safeguards are ineffective and oversight of abuses and mistakes is absent.

Currently, eight states and the District of Columbia have passed assisted suicide laws that make it legal for doctors to prescribe lethal drugs to patients diagnosed with terminal illness and with a prognosis of 6 months or less to live, if certain procedural steps are followed.

Despite the belief that pain relief is the primary motivation for seeking assisted suicide, in *Assisted Suicide Laws and their Danger to People with Disabilities*, NCD found that the most prevalent reasons offered by someone requesting assisted suicide are directly related to unmet service and support needs, which NCD urges policy makers respond to through legislative changes and funding.

"Assisted suicide laws are premised on the notion of additional choice for people at the end of their lives, however in practice, they often remove choices when the low-cost option is ending one's life versus providing treatments to lengthen it or services and supports to improve it," said NCD Chairman Neil Romano.

Closely examining the experience in Oregon, where the practice has been legal for 20 years, NCD found that the list of conditions eligible for assisted suicide has expanded considerably over time, including many disabilities that, when properly treated, do not result in death, including arthritis, diabetes, and kidney failure.

Assisted Suicide Laws and their Danger to People with Disabilities also notes suicide contagion in states where assisted suicide is legal; as well as a loosening of existing safeguards both in states with legalized assisted suicide and states considering bills to legalize.

In the report, NCD details limitations of purported safeguards of assisted suicide laws, finding:

- Insurers have denied expensive, life-sustaining medical treatment, but offered to subsidize lethal drugs, potentially leading patients to hasten their own deaths;
- Misdiagnoses of terminal disease can cause frightened patients to hasten their deaths;
- Though fear and depression often drive requests for assisted suicide, referral for psychological evaluation is extremely rare prior to doctors writing lethal prescriptions;
- Financial and emotional pressures can distort patient choice;
- Patients may "doctor shop" limitlessly to find a physician who will obtain a colleague's concurrence and prescribe a lethal dose

"As someone who has battled cancer and been given weeks to live and am still thriving years later, I know firsthand that well-intending doctors are often wrong," said Mr. Romano. "If assisted suicide is legal, lives will be lost due to mistakes, abuse, lack of information, or a lack of better options; no current or proposed safeguards can change that."

NCD concludes its research with recommendations, including highlighting the need for:
• Federal research on disability-related risk factors

in suicide prevention, as well as on people with disabilities who request assisted suicide and euthanasia:

- Federal regulation requiring non-discrimination in suicide prevention services; and
- Greater federal investment in long-term services and supports.

San Francisco bans city employees from taking work trips to 22 pro-life states

SAN FRANCISCO, October 22, 2019 (LifeSiteNews) – In its latest declaration of solidarity with abortion-on-demand and contempt for its opponents, the solidly left-wing city of San Francisco has announced a blacklist against public employees conducting business with or embarking on work-related travel to almost half the country in protest of "restrictive" pro-life state laws.

"Just as we restricted spending with states that have laws that discriminate against LGBTQ people, we are standing up against states that put women's health at risk and that are actively working to limit reproductive freedoms," San Francisco Mayor London Breed declared, according to Fox News. "By limiting travel and contracting with certain states, we are sending a clear message to states that disregard the right to abortion."

Starting January 1, 2020, the blacklist will apply to Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Kentucky, Louisiana, Massachusetts, Mississippi, Nebraska, Nevada, North Dakota, Ohio, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, South Dakota, Texas, **West Virginia**, and Wisconsin – all of which have "severe anti-choice policies" on the books, according to city leaders.

The blacklist appears to follow the pro-abortion Guttmacher Institute's overview of state abortion policies, which identifies all of the blacklisted states as banning abortion between 20 and 24 weeks of pregnancy – a point around which preborn babies are capable of feeling pain.

"Although tax revenue from San Francisco alone may not be sufficient to encourage states to rethink their laws, if other cities and states follow San Francisco's lead, the financial pressure might be enough to prompt policy changes," Breed's office declared.



WVFL Treasurer's Article U.S. Code Section 230 and Big Tech Bias

Last time I called attention to Big Tech bias leaning left—such as social platforms blocking pro-life groups from advertising. Of course the problem runs deeper than ads, including shadow banning, search results suppressed, mysterious sudden reductions in numbers of followers, and so on. The issues seem prevalent on all the biggest platforms: Facebook, Twitter, Pinterest, Instagram, etc. Recently our WVFL Program Director was temporarily restricted from interaction with Facebook groups.

A conservative educational group, Prager University (PragerU), led by Dennis Prager, a conservative pro-life Jewish man, is suing Google/ YouTube (Google owns YouTube) for restricting viewers' access to clean, conservative PragerU videos. The tech giant has actually violated its

own policies in miscategorizing clean videos about the Ten Commandments (and dozens of other PragerU videos, including with pro-life messages) as pornographic, to discourage viewers from clicking through an extra layer of restriction to watch the videos.

U.S. Code section 230 is a key part of the discussion. (Read up on it.) We don't want Internet platforms to be "the wild west" where anything goes, including child pornography and sex trafficking. We need common sense filtering and moderation. However, we also want pro-life truths (part of dissenting, conservative political views) to not be suppressed because of leftist bias in staff/leadership of big tech companies and their social platforms.

"San Francisco is showing other cities and states how to stand up against dangerous laws that restrict a woman's right to control her own body," Planned Parenthood Northern California CEO Gilda Gonzales said in support, according to SF Gate. "Now, more than ever, we must work to expand, not ban, reproductive rights for all."

"I don't think (San Francisco's government) has any real power with this boycott," Pro-Life San Francisco executive director Terrisa Bukovinac responded in comments to *The Daily Signal*. "It's a PR tactic. This is an attempt to fire up their base, but I don't think that even they expect this to stand up to actual scrutiny in a courtroom."

"The pro-life movement in this area has grown exponentially," Bukovinac added. "We have more than a dozen people organizing in the Bay Area right now. We are millennial-led, we are seeing a lot of crossover from the animal-rights community and from the Catholic community, and we've all been able to come together in a bipartisan way (...) Killing other human beings is not progressive."

Nicole Flynn also spoke at the Teen Day Camp that went on in conjunction with the adult convention. The younger group participated in a Q&A with two of the youngest members of the West Virginia House of Delegates–Kayla Kessinger and Caleb Hanna (himself a teen at the time).


