From the President



Polling and the 2020 Election

Dear friends,

West Virginians for Life is very proud to have been able to work with our State Legislature to pass the Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act. It passed with overwhelming bipartisan support in both the House and Senate. The Governor held a public signing ceremony for our bill.

This bill will provide for specific actions to be taken when an abortionist has a case of an abortion survivor. The abortionist must provide the same care for the abortion survivor as for any other baby born at the same gestational age. This bill makes it possible for the first time to investigate and prosecute these cases because West Virginia law will define the actions required by the abortionist and the penalties for failure to comply with the law.

Our pro-abortion opponents argued that the bill should not be pursued because infanticide is already against the law. Indeed, in 2002, the U.S. Congress approved, without a dissenting vote, the Born-Alive Infants Protection Act stating that "every infant member of the species homo sapiens who is born alive at any stage of development" is a "person" for all federal law purposes. However, there have been no cases involving prosecutions under the 2002 Act because there is no federal criminal statute specifically prohibiting taking the lives of born-alive infants.

Our new law provides for the protections here in West Virginia that are envisioned by the 2002 Congressional Act. It provides for criminal acts and penalties that make prosecution possible.

In addition, our pro-abortion opponents argued that there are no cases of late-term abortions in the state, because we have passed a law banning abortions after 20 weeks for fetal pain. However, there are many reasons why there might be such cases. Our laws banning late-term abortions have exceptions, such as when a mother's life is endangered by extending the pregnancy. Dates and timing of pregnancy can be in error, and medical staff can make mistakes assigning the age of the fetus.

A nurse in a West Virginia Hospital, a number of years ago, discovered a newly-born baby crying on a utility sink on the ward. When she ran to report it to the staff on the ward, it was clear that these situations were routine but not reported. Our bill will make reporting mandatory. The West Virginia nurse was told to leave it alone. Instead, against orders, she held the baby, baptized him and named him John. She promised him she would be his voice. She subsequently produced a video that she called "The Voice of John" which depicts her story. (It can be found on the wvforlife.org website.)

Passage of this law in WV means that John's voice has finally been heard. The members of the State Legislature, the Governor and all the supportive leadership here in West Virginia have heard his voice and have taken action to respond. West Virginians for Life salutes them and thanks them for their commitment to making West Virginia a state that supports all life including the unborn and newborn.

Unfortunately, there are members of the House of Delegates, who have failed to hear the voice of John. Those few who voted against the bill are deaf to the cries of babies being aborted who survive. We, who hear those cries, clearly must continue to work to be their voice.

Bishop Brennan's Pro-Life Rally Remarks In Brief

Bishop Mark Brennan offered the invocation and spoke on the steps of the Capitol at the Pro-Life Rally on February 24 in Charleston. Annual Pro-Life Rally Day, organized by West Virginians for Life, celebrated the passage of the born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act.

Bishop Brennan spoke of the late Cardinal Joseph Bernadin of Chicago, who spoke of a "seamless garment" of life issues. He took the phrase right from the New Testament, the bishop said, where the garment that Jesus wore, and for which the soldiers on duty at his crucifixion cast lots, was described as one without seams. Using this image, the cardinal argued that all human beings at all stages of development and in all circumstances deserve respect and assistance, the bishop said.

"It is important to consider, however, that the seamless garment had a hem," Bishop Brennan said. "Probably made by folding over the edges, the hem kept the garment from fraying and likely coming apart."

"In the range of life issues, I believe that respect for the life of the unborn child is the hem," Bishop Brennan said. "You could stand over an aborted child and say, 'Society should assure you decent housing, a job, health care and a good education' but none of these things would benefit the child because



that child is dead. The hem that keeps the seamless garment together and gives to a person the opportunity to access these other personal and social goods is respect for that person's life from the moment of conception. Take away that right and nothing else matters. Respect for the unborn child's life is the foundation of all other rights."

Born-Alive Bill Passes and Governor Justice Signs It

The Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act (HB 4007/SB 231) had undergone a change in wording in the Senate (February 10) after passing in the House (January 15). The vote to concur in the House by a 92-6 vote on February 18, saw the wording changed from "fetus" to "child." This would be the final verbiage as the Senate concurred with that House version by a unanimous 33-0 vote on February 19. Only pro-abortion Senator Bob Beach was conspicuously absent both times.

The Senate voted 32-0 in favor of the bill on February 10, 2020. The Born-Alive Bill's overwhelming House passage by a 93-5 margin on January 15 was bipartisan as well.

Lead sponsors of the bill were Delegates Ruth Rowan and Senator Patricia Rucker. Senate cosponsors were Senate President Mitch Carmichael as well as Senators Sue Cline, Bill Hamilton, Mark Maynard, Rollan Roberts, Dave Sypolt, and Eric Tarr.

House cosponsors were Delegates Trenton Barnhart, Kevan Bartlett, Tom Bibby, Tom Fast, Geoff Foster, Caleb Hanna, John Paul Hott, Dean Jeffries, Joe Jeffries, Larry Kump, Daniel Linville, Chuck Little, Patrick Martin, Zack Maynard, Chris Phillips, Eric Porterfield, Terri Sypolt, Chris Toney, Terry Waxman, and Evan Worrell.

The Born-Alive Bill will enact requirements that a baby born alive during an abortion must be afforded "the same degree" of care that would apply "to any other child born alive at the same gestational age," including transportation to a hospital; and mandatory reporting of violations. It also makes it possible, for the first time, to investigate



and prosecute these cases because West Virginia law will define the actions required by the abortionist in the case of a born-alive survivor of abortion along with the penalties for failure to comply with the law.

WVFL President Wanda Franz, Ph.D., said: "West Virginians for Life thanks the legislators and leadership in our state Capitol for passing the Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act. This new law puts teeth in our state legal system to make it possible to report and prosecute these cases. The people of West Virginia want these infants to be protected by West Virginia law."

In a press release midway through the 60-day session, WVFL Legislative Coordinator Karen Cross said, "Once again West Virginia legislators have shown overwhelming bipartisan support of a simple, compassionate, commonsense bill to protect babies in the Mountain State who might survive abortions,"

She also lamented that Nancy Pelosi and her entourage have not been cooperative with similar legislation on the federal level. All of West Virginia's federal lawmakers voted for the Born-Alive Bill in the past, however, under Nancy Pelosi's leadership, it has been thwarted over 80 times.

The WV bill takes effect 90 days from passage on May 19.

Living Will Bill to Return in 2021

The Options in Living Wills bill, which had been proposed both this session and in 2019, again did not pass.

Sponsors had been found in both the Senate and House, but due to push-back from certain hospital ethics committees and from the Hospice Council, Senator Mike Maroney, chairperson of the Senate Health committee, decided not to put it on the agenda.

However, we continue to research the issues and refine the bill, as well as educate senators and delegates. End of life issues are a relatively new area of focus for WVFL, and it appears few legislators yet have these dangers on their "radar screen."

This year's version had even more protective language relating to patients diagnosed to be in persistent vegetative state, so the time was not wasted in continuing the discussion among lawmakers and other organizations.

It is hoped that a meeting with those groups that expressed opposition will be had shortly after the session is over, so that disagreements might be ironed out before next year.

Over 30 Years of Pro-Life Service Recognized

As he said to us after the presentation, "There are no other issues where I have a 100% voting record, but this one."



Candidate Surveys & Voting Records

The following charts are a service to you describing the pro-life records of the candidates running in this year's primary election. The first four columns consist of selected questions from the West Virginians for Life Candidate Survey. The questions for each are presented here. A "yes" answer is pro-life for all four questions. If no response is indicated, a survey was not received. An asterisk (*) indicates written comments were included.

Among others, the following four selected questions were asked:

- 1 = Would you vote for an abortion pill reversal bill?
- 2 = Would you vote to prevent the use of tax funds for abortion other than to prevent the death of the mother?
- 3 = Would you vote for a bill to correct the WV Code on Living Wills to protect patient rights by providing for a choice in whether or not to receive artificially-provided food and fluids when in a terminal condition or chronic vegetative state?
- 4 = Would you oppose the legalization of assisting suicide through lethal prescription?

Gov Ovr = Override vote of Governor Tomblin's veto of The Unborn Child Protection from Dismemberment Abortion Act on 3/10/2016. Y is a pro-life vote. N is for no. A is for absent.

SJR 12 = Constitutional Amendment to make the WV Constitution abortion neutral and abortion funding neutral (2/9/2018 in Senate and 3/5/2018 in House). Y is a pro-life vote. N is for no. A is for absent.

Born-Alive Bill = Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act to ensure proper medical care is given to an infant abortion survivor + legal recourse (2/18/2020 in House and 2/19/2020 in Senate). Y is a pro-life vote. N is no. A is for absent.







WVFL thanks Bo for his passionate defense of human life and shares his vision of a need for bold leaders who are willing to take a stand for life.



WV makes nationwide news again with pro-life leadership

The Christian Post's national headline reads: "W.Va. governor signs law requiring doctors to help babies born alive after abortion." It's newsworthy that our WV legislators succeeded in bipartisan passage of the very thing federal lawmakers can't even bring to the floor: actionable protection for babies who survive abortionists' best efforts to kill them. The Mountain State's leadership continues to be noticed, and we're genuinely influencing other states with pro-life values.

One of my WV friends responded with, "This is good, but how about we outlaw abortion...period!" That's definitely the goal. Legal challenges are certain, however, and they would wind up at the U.S. Supreme Court's door. So long as we lack

a majority of justices willing to overturn *Roe*, each opportunity that SCOTUS turns away from tends to actually make it worse (for example, consider the new "undue burden" standard crafted by the 1992 Casey ruling). Even just last summer the high court overturned dismemberment abortion ban laws such as ours—a WVFL victory, passed in 2016, now wrongfully deemed unconstitutional and unenforceable. Overturning the bad precedents of *Roe* is doable, but it will require a willing court. Sadly, indications are it's not there yet, but we're making headway. We've got to keep a pro-life President in office and a pro-life majority in the Senate, to keep getting better judges & justices on the bench at all levels. 
Raleigh

Governor Suspends Medical Procedures Due to Pandemic

West Virginians for Life applauds Governor Jim Justice, who, with the support of Attorney General Patrick Morrisey, announced on March 31, that all health care facilities postpone all surgeries and procedures that are not medically necessary during the current COVID-19 pandemic.

In his statement the Governor said he would "suspend all elective medical procedures" effective 11:59 p.m. tonight. - 3/31/20

In this excerpt from a press release issued by West Virginians for Life (WVFL), "The purpose of these directives is to prevent the spread of COVID-19 and to preserve personal protective equipment (PPE) for use by those engaged in serving the needs of COVID-19 patients."

Wanda Franz, Ph.D., president of West Virginians for Life, stated, "In a February 2020 West Virginia poll conducted by Triton Polling, only 22% of registered voters support abortion for elective reasons. We support Governor Justice and Attorney General Morrisey in protecting the public and preserving resources for use by those fighting COVID-19."

National Right to Life Director of State Legislation Ingrid Duran commented that, "West Virginians understand elective abortions are not healthcare. Abortion facilities should instead donate PPE's to the brave healthcare workers working day and night to save lives."

Attorney General Patrick Morrisey said the day the announcement was made that he was "prepared to defend the Governor's executive order."
