Two of the highlights in the 2020 Primary election returns on Tuesday, June 9, were the wins by incumbent Governor Jim Justice (won 63% of the vote) and incumbent Chief Justice Tim Armstead to a 12-year term on the State Supreme Court-Division 1. West Virginians for Life Political Action Committee (WVL-PAC) believes that in November Justice will provide a stark contrast to Democrat challenger Ben Salango. As for Armstead, his firm, family-friendly leadership will continue. The court makeup is still a solid pro-life 3-2 majority.

Except for two of the other Supreme Court races, every single federal and statewide race was won by a WVL-PAC endorsed candidate. WVL-PAC endorsed Senator Shelley Moore Capito will be challenged by Paula Jean Swearengin on November 3. The PAC is also pleased with the wins of Representatives David McKinley, Alex Mooney and Carol Miller in Congressional Districts 1, 2, and 3.

Pro-life Senate President Mitch Carmichael lost the Republican nomination to pro-life challenger Amy Nichole Grady in the 4th Senatorial District. "Senate President Mitch Carmichael was instrumental in the passing of numerous pieces of pro-life legislation over his years in office," said WVFL Legislative Coordinator Karen Cross. "Many lives have been saved because of his steadfast commitment to the unborn. Well done, good and faithful servant."

Of the 140 races where the WVL-PAC made endorsements, there were 121 victories or 86%. In the 19 cases where the WVL-PAC-endorsed candidates did not prove to be successful, at least nine winners are pro-life.

The following quote can be attributed to Wanda Franz, Ph.D., President of West Virginians for Life PAC: "Given the challenges that the pandemic presented, WVL-PAC is pleased with the election results overall. The PAC works to support pro-life candidates from both parties. The overwhelming pro-life successes in this election are, in part, due to voters' desire to elect legislators at both the federal and state levels. who reflect their values regarding the dignity of each human life. West Virginians for Life looks forward to seeing increased support for pro-life candidates in the general election in November."

## Actions Speak Louder than Words

Dear friends,

There are many both inside and outside of the prolife movement who doubt the sincerity of President Trump's belief in the pro-life cause. This doubt is partly based on the fact that he spent a portion of his adult life claiming to be "pro-choice." However, he has also claimed to have had an important personal experience that caused him to change his position. There are many in the pro-life movement today who have gone through the same transformation. How do we determine the sincerity of these transformations?

There is no way to determine it except through the actions of the individual once in office. In that regard, President Trump has proven himself. He knows the impact his personal presence makes on people, which he demonstrates at his rallies. His attendance at this year's March for Life was his way of giving his personal gift to the pro-life movement.

However, even more than his public statements, it is what he does behind the scenes that shows his dedication to the cause of life. providing Federal tax dollars to groups that give out contraception because they can no longer use that money to fund abortions. For the first time, the law passed by Congress has been correctly implemented.

Governor Jim Justice has signed every bill that has come to his desk and held a public signing of this year's Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act. Due to the Coronavirus Pandemic, he called for closure of all non-essential medical treatments to free the hospitals to treat the expected cases of the virus. He worked with Attorney General Morrisey to include abortion as a non-essential medical procedure. These public servants have demonstrated their courageous commitment to the pro-life cause.

West Virginians for Life is proud to report that, in West Virginia, due to the courageous actions taken by Governor Jim Justice and Attorney General Patrick Morrisey, abortions are not considered essential medical procedures. Due to the COVID-19 crisis and the national shortage of personal protective equipment, on March 31, 2020, Governor Justice issued an executive order designed to provide capacity in the West Virginia healthcare system for the expected surge of COVID-19 patients.

## Legislation for 2021 - Abortion Pill Reversal

In the United States, if a woman wants to abort her pregnancy, she has two choices. She can get a surgical abortion which involves the abortionist invading her womb to remove the pregnancy. Different techniques are used depending on the age of her baby. The second method is referred to as a "medical" or "chemical" abortion. In this approach, the woman takes pills which kill the baby, and she then "delivers" the dead baby by herself at her home.

The actual expulsion of the baby is stressful and bloody and the woman often sees her dead baby, which can be traumatic and emotionally damaging. Abortion facilities have been known to play down the negative aspects of this abortion method.

If the woman chooses to have this procedure, she will be given the abortion pill at the office of the abortionist. The abortion pill is Mifepristone. It has been available in the United States since 2000 and 30-45% of abortions are performed using Mifepristone (approximately 300,000-450,000 each year). The abortion pill kills the baby by interfering with the chemical changes that occur in the mother's body to provide the protective lining in the womb that sustains the embryo. The pill causes the lining to slough off and the embryo dies.

If nothing more is done at this point, there is a 15% survival rate of the baby, that is, the abortion failure rate is about 15%. In addition, around 40% of these women will not completely empty their uterus and a follow-up surgical procedure must be done at that point.

To help avoid these problems, the abortionist gives the woman a second pill called Misoprostol, which causes the uterus to contract and remove

the contents, that is, the dead baby. This pill is to be taken at home 24-48 hours after ingesting the abortion pill. Often, when the woman returns home and has time to really think about it, she begins to regret her

decision to abort her baby. If she contacts the abortionist, she is often told that reversing the procedure is impossible, or that, if reversed and she gives birth to her baby, he/she will likely have disabilities.

Both pieces of information are false. First, it is possible to reverse the effects of the abortion pill. This is done by giving the mother high levels of Progesterone. This is the chemical that causes the lining of the uterus to become thick enough to keep the embryo alive. The mechanism for

the reversal procedure is to use the Progesterone to override the effects of the Mifepristone. The success rate for this method is between 55% and 70%.

Secondly, there is no risk to the developing baby from Progesterone or Mifepristone. There is a very small risk to the baby from the use of the second pill, the Misoprostol. However, if the reversal is successful, it is because the use of Progesterone

has overridden the Misoprostol. Thus, there is no negative impact on the baby brought to term following the use of the abortion reversal procedure.

Dr. George Delgado developed the

abortion reversal procedure and hundreds of women in the United States and 14 other countries have successfully used his method to give birth to their babies. Nine states currently have laws providing for doctors to give this important reversal information to their clients, including Arizona, Arkansas, South Dakota, Utah, Idaho, North Dakota, Kentucky, Oklahoma, and Nebraska.

West Virginians for Life will be introducing a bill in the 2021 legislative session to require abortionists to tell their clients that it is possible to reverse these chemical abortions. Women deserve accurate information about their abortion decisions. In the landmark Supreme Court case, Planned Parenthood v. Casey 505 U.S. 833 (1992), the court held that the state has a legitimate interest in making sure women are fully informed, when they state:

"In attempting to ensure that a woman apprehend the full consequences of her decision, the State furthers the legitimate purpose of reducing the risk that a woman may elect an abortion, only to discover later, with devastating psychological consequences that her decision was not fully informed. If the information the state requires to be made available to the woman is truthful and not misleading, the requirement may be permissible."

Our bill will not tell physicians how to practice medicine but will simply require them to inform their clients that abortion reversal is possible. It will protect the rights of women by providing them with information and will not place obstacles on women seeking abortions. Informed consent legislation is not an attack on personal freedom, but a guarantee of it. It is constitutional because it safeguards a woman's right to know.

More information about our bill will be available as we get closer to the Legislative Session in January.

# State Pro-Life Convention in October will Highlight Rebekah Hagan's Successful Abortion Pill Reversal Story - Son is now six.

Rebekah Hagan is one of today's youngest speakers on the issues of teenage pregnancy, abortion and abortion pill reversal.

Raised in a Christian home where abortion was never discussed, Rebekah's role in the pro-life movement was unplanned and fueled, instead, by firsthand experience. She became pregnant at seventeen with her son, Eli, and again with a second child while in her first year of college.

Feeling ashamed and fearing that she would lose her family's support and have to drop out of school, Rebekah thought that raising two children alone would be impossible. At just over seven weeks pregnant, she began a medication abortion that would later change her life.

Her story, however, did not end after taking the abortion pill. Minutes after leaving the clinic, she experienced a radical change of heart and turned to the internet to search for a way out. Feeling determined to reverse her mistake, Rebekah underwent what most thought would be an impossible attempt to save her baby.

At age twenty, she began speaking across the United States and sharing her own story of hope and redemption, which has caught the attention of both local and national media, as well as religious and secular organizations, including Vice News HBO, Focus On The Family, and World Magazine.

A passionate advocate for grace-centered outreach, Rebekah Hagan uses her story to unravel the mindset of women in unplanned pregnancies, and to equip and encourage others to lead with hope and compassion.

Rebekah is a graduate of William Jessup University, and she and her family reside in Roseville, California where she works for her local pregnancy center.

## Unborn children could possibly be saved by abortion pill reversal.

The abortion pill, known as Mifiprex or RU-486, is the first drug in a two-drug, multi-step process that has the potential to be reversed after the first step. The abortion pill reversal hotline has received over 2,000 calls from hopeful women who changed their minds once they realized the pill might be reversed.

The first step, using Mifepristone, blocks progesterone effects, shutting down the system that provides nutrients to the baby.

A second drug, Misoprostol, taken a day or so later, triggers severe cramping and bleeding to the mother in order to expel the baby.

It may be possible for a woman to reverse the intended effects of Mifepristone within 24 to 48 hours after taking it, but before taking Misoprostol, with a safe and effective reversal method for women who change their minds. Babies have already been saved this way!

# National Right to Life says Planned Parenthood should return \$80 million in funds intended for small businesses


WASHINGTON – According to a report on May 19 from Fox News, thirty-seven Planned Parenthood affiliates applied for and received more than \$80 million in funds from the Small Business Administration's Paycheck Protection Program, created by Congress to provide relief for small businesses with fewer than 500 employees.

Planned Parenthood has more than 16,000 employees nationwide.

"The Paycheck Protection Program is designed to protect small businesses, not behemoth organizations with over 16,000 employees," said Carol Tobias, president of National Right to

Life. "Planned Parenthood should return the \$80 million in funds."

According to its most recent annual report, Planned Parenthood reported performing 345,672 abortions for 2018, the most the organization has ever reported. That figure represents 40.1% of all the abortions the Guttmacher Institute says were performed in the U.S. in 2017 (the most recent



year available).

The abortion giant also reported \$1,638,600,000 in revenue for 2018-2019. These figures continue to cement Planned Parenthood's reputation as the country's top abortion performer and promoter.

West Virginians for Life stands in agreement with National Right to Life.

## Abortions Considered Essential Procedures?

The order applied to all licensed health care professionals and all licensed health care facilities in the State. It stated that "all elective medical procedures are hereby prohibited, provided that patients will still have access to urgent, medically necessary procedures like those needed to preserve the patient's life or long-term health. The term 'elective' includes medical procedures that are not immediately medically necessary to preserve the patient's life or long-term health, except those procedures that cannot be postponed without compromising the patient's long-term health."

West Virginians for Life encouraged Governor Justice and Attorney General Morrisey to declare abortion an elective medical procedure. Approximately 95% of all abortions done in the United States are elective procedures. The lives and health of these women are not in question when obtaining most abortions. It was clear that West Virginia would be sued as was happening in other states, including Ohio and Texas. Attorney General Patrick Morrisey was prepared to support Governor Justice's decision in Court in the event of a suit. He believes the state can uphold the claim that abortion procedures fall under the definition of

all other non-essential medical services that are not "immediately medically necessary to preserve the patient's life or long-term health."

West Virginians for Life salutes Governor Justice and Attorney General Morrisey for their courageous stand. As expected, the Women's Health Center of West Virginia sued Patrick Morrisey in The United States District Court for the Southern District of West Virginia. They claimed that they were only able to perform 9 of the 105 abortions that they anticipated in April.

The counter-argument is that non-essential medical treatments can be set aside during a national emergency and elective abortions are, without question, an example of such procedures.

The ban on non-essential medical procedures has been lifted for the end of May and the lawsuit is now moot and will not be pursued. We now have precedent for abortion to be recognized as "non-essential" in the state. In West Virginia, only 22% of registered voters support abortion for elective reasons. (2/05-07/20, Triton Polling). We are proud to live in a state where the leadership respects the pro-life position of the people of the state.

When NY passed the "Reproductive Health Act" (allowing abortions on demand up until birth), she attended the Day of Mourning event in Albany hosted by Elizabeth Johnston. At that point, she knew God was calling her to do more. She decided to begin going to the Women's Health Center of WV to reach out to abortion-minded women. This led her to start a chapter of Sidewalk Advocates for Life in WV. Through this organization, Tranae facilitates a training course to better equip others like her who feel called to be the last line of defense for women in crisis pregnancies.

Tranae recently became the chapter president of Wayne County Chapter of WFVL. She hopes to learn how to be a good leader and to encourage new membership, as well as increase overall participation from current members. She desires to focus on reaching young people and leaving a lasting impression on the sanctity of life. Planned Parenthood, the National Abortion Federation of America, and WV Free are targeting our children and she understands that we need to reach out to them and be a voice of reason.

Locally, lack of participation from churches and their members is a challenge. Tranae shares that she cannot understand why so many churches are silent when it comes to the sin of abortion. On a larger scale, she sees the lack of unity within the pro-life movement as a major barrier. While many have different ideas as to what to do next, she believes the end goal is ultimately the same.

Tranae's hope is that the movement will no longer be necessary. She prays that, one day in her lifetime, abortion will not only be against the law, but unthinkable. Until then, she hopes the church will wake up and stand in the gap.

WVFL thanks Tranae for pouring her heart and her energies into serving God's precious gift of life, and shares her belief that we need not only to protest what is wrong, but to proclaim what is right in deed and in truth!


