On January 10th, WVFL's Host Sponsor Luncheon kicked off fundraising efforts related to the 27th Annual Rose Dinner. Senator Chris Rose hosted the event, which was held at the Marriott Waterfront in Morgantown. The audience was first treated to a review of 16 major legislative victories that they had helped to accomplish over the decades. This was accomplished with the animated assembly of a beautiful puzzle that had been created by WVFL Treasurer Doug Joseph. The presentation showed how the abortion community is attempting to skirt WV's pro-life laws, and segued into explaining a strategy to educate the women of West Virginia.

The main points of this pro-life strategy include: 1) Educating about the dangers of obtaining chemical abortions using RU-486 pills; 2) Publicizing the truth that abortion pill reversal is safe and effective; and, 3) Protecting West Virginians from the dangerous abortion industry by describing the plans and methods the industry uses to make money. In order to fund this strategy, generous attendees gave and pledged more than \$50,000 towards the ultimate goal of \$250,000.

Texas Attorney General Brings Case Against New York Abortion Pill Provider

One reason abortions have not fallen more since the 2022 Dobbs decision that overturned Roe is that doctors in abortion friendly states are shipping abortion pills to women in states where they are not legal. Earlier this month, Texas Attorney General Ken Paxton filed a suit against Maggie Carpenter, a doctor from New York, who had a telehealth conference with a woman from Collin County, to whom she prescribed and shipped abortion pills sometime early past summer.


The Attorney General's office found out about the illegal sale after the woman ended up in the hospital with severe bleeding and the baby's father discovered the mother had gotten the drugs responsible from Carpenter. The mother was not charged, as it is never the intention of the law to do so, but Paxton sued the New York abortionist for multiple violations of Texas law.

The Lawsuit

Carpenter, Paxton alleges, was practicing medicine without a (Texas) license, performed an abortion in violation of Texas Health and Safety Code, and in several ways specifically violated Texas law regarding chemical abortions. That is by providing an abortion-inducing drug by courier, delivery, or mail service; not having the required admitting privileges at a hospital within 30 miles of where the abortion performed (to handle complications); failing to examine the pregnant woman to determine gestation is no more than 49 days gestational age before prescribing; and failing to schedule a follow-up visit.

Texas AG Paxton is seeking an injunction that enjoins Carpenter from illegally prescribing abortion inducing drugs to residents of Texas and from illegally practicing medicine in the state.

The full penalty sought is not listed in the complaint. However, the suit says, "The attorney general is



Paxton filed the suit in Collin County District Court, the jurisdiction where the 20-year old woman ordered, received, and took the abortion pills and was eventually treated for complications.

Dear Friends,

The women of the United States are being poorly served by the government. The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) bowed to proabortion advocates and changed most of the guidelines that had been put into place by the French company that developed and tested RU-486, the mifepristone drug. They established the two-drug process. Mifepristone, which kills the unborn baby, is taken in the clinic. The woman is sent home with a second pill (misoprostol) to induce uterine contractions to expel the dead unborn baby. The French company recommended that the women return to the clinic three times for medical supervision. However, many of their recommendations were changed by the FDA.

For example, the FDA raised the limit on the recommended safe use of the drugs from 7 weeks to 10 weeks. Research had shown that the later in pregnancy the drugs are used, the more dangerous they are to the woman. Failure rates of the procedure increase with pregnancy age: 8% in the first trimester to 38.5% in the second trimester.

In addition, the FDA's other changes allow women to order and use these dangerous pills without ever seeing a doctor. Thus, women have absolutely no verification of the age of the pregnancy and no verification of whether or not the pregnancy is ectopic (that is, in the fallopian tube). An untreated ectopic pregnancy causes the tube to burst, and this is the most dangerous situation that occurs in pregnancy. Pill-induced

abortions hide the ectopic pregnancy's presence, since the symptoms of both are the same: pain and heavy bleeding. In the United States, there have been 26 deaths and thousands of complications, such as hemorrhage and infection.

The United States has no requirement for reporting damage from complications of chemical abortions. In foreign countries where this data is collected, chemical abortions have four times the rate of complications of surgical abortions: 20% of women have excessive bleeding that requires a hospital visit, and 8% of women using the pills early in pregnancy will require surgical completion of their abortion.

But, what does the woman actually experience? Chemical abortions are painful and bloody and may occur at home without any care or supervision. The woman is actually delivering a baby, which she might see, and the process takes longer -- days to weeks -- to be fully completed. The pain is more severe than normal because the contractions are being artificially stimulated by the second pill.

These are the scientifically-determined facts about the use of abortion pills. We need to provide education for the people of West Virginia to protect them from using these dangerous drugs, and you can help us protect our women.



Priority Legislation

The current legislative session will address multiple pieces of pro-life legislation. Two of these involve The Women's Right to Know Act and The Support for Mothers and Babies Act.

West Virginia's pro-life protective law contains certain limited exceptions to the state's prohibition on abortion. Outside of cases of medical emergency, it's important that mothers considering abortion are empowered with relevant information necessary to choose life. **The Women's Right to Know Act**, will ensure that happens by reinstating *comprehensive informed consent* protections for these women before they decide whether or not to obtain the abortion. Information that will be provided includes facts about surgical and chemical abortions; the abortion pill reversal procedure; options for perinatal hospice in the circumstance of an unborn child who may not survive long outside of the womb; parenting and adoption resources; and the right to see an ultrasound of their baby if they wish. When given information like this, more women choose life for their babies.

The Support for Mothers and Babies Act has been a huge win for mothers, babies, and families in West Virginia. This program, which the Legislature created in 2023, now serves West Virginians in all 55 counties and has brought in over 4,000 new clients to pro-life pregnancy help organizations.

Last year, the Legislature graciously granted \$3 million dollars in funding for pro-life pregnancy help organizations. Pregnancy resource centers, maternity

homes, and family support networks have registered to receive funding to better serve their communities. None of these organizations refer for, commit, or in any way support the abortion industry.

The Support for Mothers and Babies Program currently distributes the funds on a fee-for-service basis, meaning that the pregnancy help organization must first provide the service, and then seek reimbursement for it. It is working well for established organizations. However, funds are not available for start-up costs to establish new centers, nor for things like the purchase of an ultrasound machine or the repair of a roof on a maternity home. To remedy this problem, West Virginians for Life, in consultation with the WV Pregnancy Center Coalition, is supporting a change to the language that would allow the program to pay for larger one-time expenses. "We have money to serve and help moms and babies in desperate situations by opening more maternity homes and better training our staff. It has been effective, but could be even more so with this change," says the Executive Director of the Support for Mothers and Babies Program, Jenny Enstminger.

WVFL hopes to see eligible expenses added to the authorizing statute of the Support for Mothers and Babies Program. This would mean that Pregnancy Help Organization (PHO) funding may be distributed to cover facility needs, training costs of staff and volunteers, and other large capital expenditures necessary to expand services.

Governor Morrisey on Inauguration Day

West Virginians for Life congratulates Patrick Morrisey as he begins his tenure as the 37th Governor of West Virginia. Morrisey built a strong pro-life record as the state's Attorney General, a position he held for 12 years. During that time, he joined other states' Attorneys General in letters to the CEOs of Walgreens and CVS, warning them against selling abortion pills in contradiction of the state's pro-life laws. When the Dobbs decision was announced reversing Roe v Wade, he upheld the state's 19th Century criminal law against abortion and confronted the state's pro-abortion forces, who sued him for the decision. The suit became moot once the West Virginia Legislature passed our law protecting the lives of unborn babies from conception onward. Morrisey also stood up to – and ultimately defeated – a lawsuit from an abortion pill manufacturer attacking our new law.



The WV Alliance for Ethical Health Care, a subcommittee of West Virginians for Life, deals specifically with issues at the other end of the spectrum of life, i.e. hastened death at the end of life due to a "poor quality of life" perception, discrimination in access to medical care, physician-assisted suicide, and euthanasia.

But There's Still Death in the Details

One certainly would like to breathe a sigh of relief and thanksgiving since Amendment 1 passed last November, and our state constitution now prohibits physician-assisted suicide, euthanasia, and mercy killing in West Virginia. (We are the first state in America to pass such a constitutional amendment.)

But does this mean all West Virginians are now forever safe from the dangerous practice of assisted suicide? Not necessarily. Unfortunately, two of the eleven jurisdictions (10 states, and Washington, D.C.) that have legalized physician-assisted suicide in the United States have removed their former requirement that the patient be a resident of that jurisdiction. The states that have removed their residency requirement are Oregon and

Vermont.....so far. That means that a WV resident can travel to Oregon or Vermont and, assuming they meet all the requirements of that particular state's law, access assisted suicide there. This is called "suicide tourism."

In fact, we have seen evidence that both Oregon and Vermont are aware of, and attempting to enable, suicide tourism to their state. Hotels are recommended for out-of-state patients to use for their stay. Social workers are trained to collect the dead bodies after lethal doses are taken. It is becoming a commercial enterprise.

The WV Alliance for Ethical Healthcare is exploring possible ways to discourage suicide tourism by WV residents. Some of the issues are whether or not medically-assisted suicide by a WV resident, even if obtained out-of-state, would disqualify recovery of life insurance benefits under the usual "suicide exclusion" clause? Will life

insurance companies in WV be able to question a death certificate from OR or VT, because it will list an underlying disease, rather than the fact that the death was caused by assisted suicide? Would accident and medical insurance policies pay for doctor consults or the lethal drugs obtained out of state? Could a Vermont or Oregon physician be able to use telehealth in West Virginia to start the process of seeing if the patient is eligible? Should an heir's signature as a witness to the request to obtain assisted suicide, or an heir's help transporting the patient out-of-state, constitute elder abuse or possibly make them an "unworthy heir" for any estate distribution?

Discussion with delegates and senators with expertise in these areas has begun. In the meantime, we must do our part reaching out to the vulnerable people in our lives, with kindness and inclusion as we are able. Let's make the idea of assisted suicide unthinkable!





Pro-Life Profile: Thomas Bishop, Alan Brant, and Other Unsung Heroes

Thomas (Tom) Bishop retired some years ago as a project manager for Union Carbide here in South Charleston and moved to Claudville, VA. He was very active in his home church and in a Christian men's fellowship group. He went home to be with the Lord very suddenly on January 11.

I well remember an incident in which some staff and supporters of West Virginians for Life were involved. Those of you who were on board in those days will recall that, for many years, Sherry and I, and our Ekklesia Ministries group, furnished A/V equipment and technicians for the annual Prolife Rally Day At The Legislature. It was always the most complicated and equipment-heavy setup we were ever called to do, because of the acoustics in the capitol rotunda.

In fact, we had a saying among ourselves that all A/V technicians who died without repenting and receiving Jesus as their Saviour would be condemned to set up a sound system in that rotunda every day for eternity. The echo factor in there is just about insolvable if you have a large crowd attending, and if you were among those there from WVFL you will remember that in those days the crowd overflowed the place.

It was all that we could do to manage the sound


level, work with all the singers and musicians, and still generate a sound signal which could clearly be heard. We literally had to set up what amounted to three separate systems to get the desired distribution without blowing everyone's head off.

Previous to the beginning of this particular noon rally, we had received word that there might be protesters trying to break into the meeting and disrupt it. Upon hearing that, I spotted Tom Bishop in the audience. I also spotted one of my fellow workers from the Department of Employment Security named Alan Brant. (Alan was also my assistant teacher for a Bible class which I taught every Friday at noon.)

I asked Tom and Alan if they would just come and stand behind the sound equipment and to keep their eyes open for any possible disturbance. Both Tom and Alan were about 6' 4" and weighed about 220 pounds each. They came and stood, one on each side, behind the sound gear. That's all they did, just stand there.

We didn't have one scintilla of trouble.

I never forgot that, and Tom's passing brought it back to my memory. Who knows how many lives were saved, how many babies were rescued from abortion, by the presence of these two gentle

giants? (I have a distinct suspicion that there were a couple of 9-foot guys with wings standing with them.)

Just thought I'd share this with you. How many "unsung heroes" have we had who stepped out to help us in the pro-life movement? I have to say that whoever they are, great is their reward in heaven. And I am sure that Tom and Alan received a great reward. (Alan is also home with Jesus.)

More on Carpenter and "Shield Laws"

This was not an isolated occurrence for Carpenter. Carpenter identifies herself as the "Co-Medical Director and Founder of the Abortion Coalition for Telemedicine" (ACT), who has been performing "medical" and surgical abortions since 1999. In 2020, she began working with "Aid Access," the on-line abortion pill promoter and seller founded by Dutch abortion activist Rebecca Gomperts and helped launch another on-line abortion pill supplier Hey Jane later that year.

Carpenter continues to work with both groups out of her office in New York, performing telemedicine and shipping pills to women across the country, often to states like Texas where they are not legal.

Carpenter and other abortionists like her working for Aid Access, "Hey Jane," and others believe they are protected from prosecution by "shield laws" passed by abortion-friendly states like California, Colorado, Maine, Massachusetts, Rhode Island, Vermont, Washington, and Carpenter's home state, New York.

Through these "shield laws," these states assert that the actions of abortionists are to be governed by the laws of the state in which the abortionists operate rather than the laws of the states where their patients reside.

Constitutionality of "Shield Laws" in Question

This is a departure from normal legal process, which says a crime is charged and adjudicated according to the jurisdiction where the violation occurred. For example, a person from Indiana who robs a bank in Illinois is charged and prosecuted by Illinois rather than Indiana.

States are generally bound by the "Full Faith and Credit Clause" of the Constitution which requires states to respect the "public acts, records, and judicial proceedings of every other state" (Article IV, Section 1). This puts the validity of these "shield laws" in serious doubt.

Paxton's suit against Carpenter may provide a test case for the constitutionality of these so-called "shield laws."

That case will first be heard and adjudicated by the Collin County District Court, likely sometime early next year. If successful, and after any appeals are exhausted, Texas will seek to enforce its judgment by making a filing to that effect in a New York State Court. New York could accept and enforce the judgment against Carpenter, or it could assert that their "shield law" protects the abortionist from prosecution or judgments by Texas.

After appeals have gone as far as they can

in New York courts, and if New York persists in denying Texas judgment, Texas can appeal to the U.S. Supreme Court to arbitrate between the conflicting state claims.

The Supreme Court is not necessarily in the habit of taking the first instance of a particular legal dispute, but if other similar cases arise elsewhere, it may consider the issue ripe for judgment.


Why this matters

If and when the Court finally rules on this, it will be a critically important ruling. It will determine whether doctors in pro-abortion states can simply ship pills into pro-life states with impunity.

As Paxton points out, this is not simply a matter of violating Texas law, which seeks to protect unborn children from this violent end. It also protects their mothers, who risk hemorrhage, like Carpenter's patient here did, or infection, the rupture of undetected ectopic pregnancies, or even death from unmonitored, unsupervised chemical abortions.

Carpenter, Aid Access, and the other irresponsible online abortion pill promoters believe they can prescribe and ship these pills to absolute strangers who they never have to deal with again. Paxton and Texas say it's high time Carpenter and her ilk were held accountable.

We've always had to carefully adapt as quickly as possible to the reality of our current situation, but no matter that situation, we've advocated tirelessly for life. Life is worth it. As we continue the fight, current circumstances now reveal a pressing need for educating the public about the dangers of chemical abortions (Mifepristone, also known by its developmental code name "RU-486"). May God grant us the resources and abilities to achieve an overwhelming victory in uncovering lies and expounding truth. Lives depends on it. Life is worth it!
