Successful **27th Annual Rose Dinner** IN WEST VIRGINIA

FOX & Friends Weekend host and NY Times best-selling author Rachel Campos-Duffy was relatable, funny, and moving as she keynoted the 27th Annual Rose Dinner on Friday, April 25, in Morgantown. Wife to Transportation Secretary Sean Duffy and mother of nine, she shared home life stories, especially of their youngest child, Valentina, born with Down Syndrome. She reminded the crowd of over 350 that 90% of unborn children with that diagnosis are aborted in the U.S. because of the strong push by doctors to end the pregnancy.

Rachel said that not one other child in Valentina's classes has Down Syndrome, and how nice it would be for her daughter to have someone else at school that looks like her.

Rachel said that adding Valentina to their family only made them all more patient, compassionate, authentically tolerant, unconditionally loving and "in the moment." Continued on p. 8

Another Excellent Pro-Life Rally Day

West Virginians for Life held its annual Pro-Life Rally Day on Friday, March 14. in the lower rotunda of the State Capitol in Charleston on a day that would reach an uncharacteristic 80° outside.

Inside the Capitol, where attendees were encouraged to visit their legislators, the crowd was addressed by several of them at the noon rally, the highlight of the day. Included in that mix were Secretary of State Kris Warner, State Treasurer Larry Pack, Agriculture Commissioner Kent Leonhardt and several Senators and Delegates totaling 20. Many indicated that this was their primary issue.

Pro-life men, women, and children of all ages came to show support for HB 2352, Modifying the Unborn Child Protection Act (Women's Right to Know), and HB 2456, Pregnancy Support. (The latter would end up passing before the session's end, but the Women's Right to Know Act would be thwarted in commitee.)

From the

President



Passing the Baton

Dear Friends,

It is both an honor and a privilege to introduce myself as the new president of West Virginians for Life. Since its founding, this organization—and the dedicated individuals who have shaped it—have secured meaningful victories on behalf of women, children, and the most vulnerable among us in West Virginia. I am looking forward to building upon the strong foundation that has already been laid and continuing to foster a culture of life across our state.

My journey in the pro-life movement began the moment I first learned what abortion was. I was in middle school, and I overheard the word while the news played in the background. Curious, I asked my mother what it meant. Her answer left me stunned. Why was this even a thing? Who came up with this idea? How was this not illegal?

In high school, I chose abortion as the topic of my persuasive speech in my senior English class and made the case for life. It was well received. Later, I gave the same speech in a college class—admittedly in an effort to save myself some work—but the reaction was much different. I was surprised by the resistance; I suppose I was naïve, and I hadn't yet realized how controversial my position was. What was so obviously an injustice to me, I found, was not seen as such by my peers. That experience was eye-opening and it left me a bit shaken.

It was also in college that I felt a deeper calling from the Lord to get involved in the pro-life cause. Not knowing where to even begin, I did a bit of internet research and discovered the National Right to Life Academy—a six-week summer course hosted by the National Right to Life Committee. It was essentially a pro-life boot camp for college students, and with financial support from West Virginians for Life and others, I was able to attend in the summer of 2009. That experience—immersed in the ethical, legal, and practical aspects of issues like abortion, euthanasia, and assisted suicide—was one of the most formative and rewarding of my life.

Upon returning to West Virginia, I had made

connections with West Virginians for Life, as Dr. Wanda Franz served as president of the National Right to Life Committee during my time at the Academy. I was welcomed by the organization into further involvement, and I joined the board after moving to Tucker County in 2011 (where my husband Josh and I currently live and work as teachers) and have since participated in numerous events, spoken at conventions, and continued to advocate for life.

When Dr. Franz announced she would be stepping down as president, I once again felt the Lord tug at my heart. I knew it was time to step forward in a new way and continue this important work with renewed purpose.

I understand that this position is not always easy or popular. I'm no longer that younger version of myself who thought that everyone would be opposed to abortion. I've come to understand the painful complexities and challenges that so many women face—circumstances that can make abortion seem like the only or most compassionate option. That is precisely why our mission matters. We carry the truth, and that truth brings freedom—freedom from pain, from regret, and from the lasting consequences of abortion.

While our opposition argues that women deserve the right to abortion, we believe women deserve better than abortion. And through your continued support, you are helping us shape a culture where life is valued and protected for all members of society. Through education and legislation, we are saving lives, both born and unborn. Thank you for your passion and your unwavering dedication to the most vulnerable among us. I am excited for the work ahead and confident in the great things we will accomplish together.



Petitions gathered from around the state were presented to Senator Patricia Rucker who said that her election campaign had been grueling and that, had it not been for West Virginians for Life, she might have lost. She is passionate about continuing her crusade on behalf of pro-life issues.

Bishop Mark Brennan of the Wheeling-Charleston Diocese gave the invocation. Special music provided by Maranatha Church in St. Albans, WV, also added much to the event.

Then-WVFL President, Dr. Wanda Franz, told the crowd, "West Virginia women and girls are still able to go out of state for abortions, especially in Maryland, where the Charleston abortion center has opened up a new facility...The dangers are two-fold. First, Maryland (like many other pro-abortion states) have passed so-called 'shield laws' designed to 'shield' the abortionists from suits brought by out-of-state abortion clients.

Continuing her remarks, Franz said, "Second, women will often be given chemical abortions, which means they will receive a pill in the abortion center, which will kill their unborn child. Then they are given a second pill that is to be taken days later after returning home to West Virginia. The women then go through an abbreviated delivery of their unborn babies at home – without medical supervision (including for the pain and bleeding). If anything goes wrong, they have no 'attending' physician available to them."

Franz told the crowd that a huge undertaking is needed involving billboards, social media, etc. to educate the public about these dangers.

After a stirring rendition of *God Bless America*, the annual Prayer Walk, with participants carrying crosses representing unborn babies who had died and their sorrowful mothers, concluded the event.



The WV Alliance for Ethical Health Care, a subcommittee of West Virginians for Life, deals specifically with issues at the other end of the spectrum of life, i.e. hastened death at the end of life due to a "poor quality of life" perception, discrimination in access to medical care, physician-assisted suicide, and euthanasia.

Be Careful About Those Advance Directives


One might think that the concern over dangerous or simply confusing advance directives had been solved by WVFL's success in 2022, when (after four years of effort!) the Legislature agreed to update language in the Living Will found within the WV Code. Unfortunately, a few recent experiences illustrate that caution and vigilance are still necessary.

Within the past year, I have twice personally been asked at two different doctor appointments "if I had a Living Will or Medical Power of Attorney." Although I already do have a MPOA (and do NOT have a Living Will), I asked to see the forms the health care provider had on hand, and was routinely offering to patients. THE FORMS WERE OUTDATED, AND DID NOT REFLECT THE CHANGES WE HAD MADE THROUGH THE LEGISLATURE. They *still* included "persistent vegetative state" patients as persons who would have their life-prolonging interventions withdrawn, and they *still* did not clarify that by signing a Living Will, you will NOT be able to get medically assisted food and hydration. Of course, I politely but firmly informed both health care providers that the law had changed, and they needed to remedy this immediately!

Another incident that just this past week came to my attention involved a friend who, having learned of the dangers of Living Wills (they are all about *denial* of care), knew that she would no longer present to health care providers the Living Will she had signed some years ago. What my friend did *not* think of was: *had she properly revoked it?* You see, there is something in our state called the "WV E-Directive Registry." This Registry is a national electronic registry which stores medical advance care planning forms that can be accessed by health care professionals. My friend did not know *whether or not* her old Living Will had been entered into the registry. I instructed her to call the WV Center for End-of-Life Care at 304-293-0695, or to complete the e-Directive Registry Advance Directive Revocation form and submit that to the WV Center.

The other two incidents that have occurred recently involved the issue of "futile" care, typically where there are arguments between health care providers who say a patient is too sick or injured to get better and should only receive "comfort care," and families, who had not given up on the possibility of their loved one getting better, wanting the loved one to *continue* receiving treatment. In both of these real-life cases, the family contacted the Terri Schiavo Life & Hope Network through their awesome, free, 24/7 Crisis Lifeline (1-855-300-HOPE (4673)) or emailing lifeline@lifeandhope.com. In both cases, my friend quickly received medical and legal advice which resulted in the threat of a denial of care being dropped, and the loved one being treated as was desired.

Keep that phone number on your refrigerator. Revoke any Living Will you may have signed by the process listed above. Check to see if you have a life-affirming **medical power of attorney**, naming a trusted person and an alternate to make medical decisions for you if you become unable to do so yourself. Give an original, signed copy to each of your named, trusted representatives, and keep another original for yourself. For more information, go to https://nrlc.org/medethics/willtolive/states/.

Research released by the Ethics and Public Policy Center shows that mifepristone abortions have a complication rate far higher than the abortion industry admits.

"Every time pro-lifers want to challenge safety claims made about the abortion pill mifepristone, abortion advocates and their loyal media allies like to quote the claim of the drug's official label from the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) that clinical studies showed 'Serious adverse reactions were reported in <0.5% of women," said Randall K. O'Bannon, Ph.D., director of Education and Research at National Right to Life. "New data taken from the field show figures are twenty-two times that."

Jamie Bryan Hall and Ryan T. Anderson, two researchers from the Ethics and Public Policy Center (EPPC) looked at data from 865,727 insurance claims involving mifepristone abortions between 2017 and 2023.

The results were staggering. Counting only those with a report of significant or severe complications, EPPC researchers found 10.93% reporting sepsis, infection, hemorrhage, hospitalization, or some other issue that officially qualified as a "serious adverse event."

Since the data set used for the report involved the broad spectrum of women in the U.S. who obtained mifepristone abortions in 2017-2023, the real-world results probably more accurately reflect current usage and complications.

"Women are told that the complication rate for chemical abortions is minimal but hemorrhage, infection, and failure to identify rupturing ectopic pregnancies are the realities," said Dr. O'Bannon. "Tracking these complications became more difficult in 2016 when the FDA decided that medical personnel and facilities only need to report deaths—not the complications arising from the use of the abortion pill mifepristone."

Having an immense fondness for special needs children, keynote Rachel Campos-Duffy enjoyed reuniting with Chloe Kondrich in the VIP Room. The two had gotten to know each other over the years as pro-life advocates in the media spotlight. Chloe, along with her father Kurt, of "Embrace Don't Erase Down Syndrome," helped West Virginians for Life pass the Unborn Child with Down Syndrome Protection and Education Act in 2022.

The crowd also saw Wanda Franz, Ph.D., transfer the WVFL President role to Board member and Tucker County Chapter Leader Lacey Evans.

State Treasurer Larry Pack gave special remarks. He reminded those in attendance of the major pro-life successes that WVFL has had.

Around \$100,000 has been raised but \$250,000 total is needed to carry out the "Don't Swallow the Lie" project, an effort to educate girls and women about the dangers of the abortion pill. WVFL hopes to curb the flow of abortion-minded women traveling the abortion corridor to Maryland with this educational campaign.


